
"The Open Window" by H.H. Munro

Logic I

The Seventh Graders discussed the three ways to convert propositions into their logical equivalence-**Obversion**, **Conversion**, and **Contraposition**.

To Obvert a statement- 1. Change the quantity of the statement. 2. Negate the Predicate

All S is P becomes No S is non-P

No S is P becomes All S is non-P

Some S is P becomes Some S is not non-P

Some S is not P becomes Some S is non-P

To Convert a statement- Interchange the Subject and predicate terms

No S is P becomes No P is S

Some S is P becomes Some P is S

The Contraposition a statement- 1. Obvert the statement. 2. Convert the statement. 3. Obvert the statement again.

All S is P becomes All non-P is non-S

Some Sis not P becomes Some non-P is not non-S

Logic II

Conjunctive Syllogism

The major premise is a conjunctive proposition which denies that the two propositions contained in the major premise can be true at the same time.

Both ... and

Conjunctive syllogisms are valid when they deny by affirming, but are not valid when they affirm by denying.

Moods of Disjunctive Syllogisms:

Tollendo Ponens Invalid

Ponendo Tollens (Denial by affirmation)
