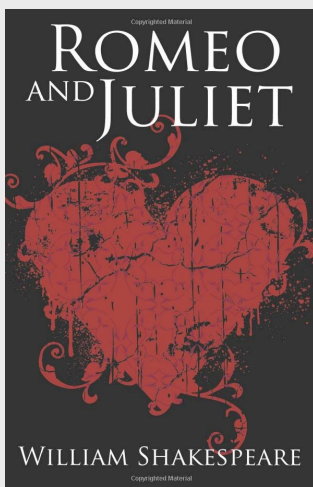

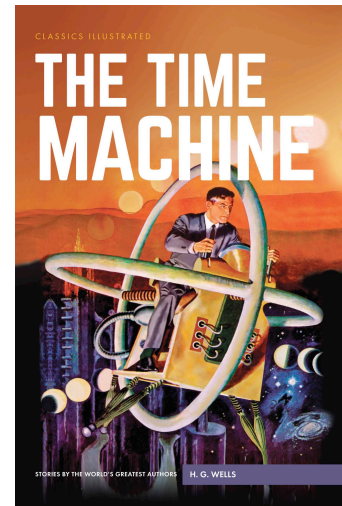


Eighth Literature

Obversion, Conversion, Contraposition Quiz Friday

The Seventh Graders are studying Distributed Terms. When we say a term is distributed, we mean that the term refers to all members of the class of things denoted by the term. A subject term is distributed when it is use universally. The subject term is distributed in a statement whose quantity is universal and undistributed in statements whose quantity is particular. In affirmative propositions, the predicate term is always taken particularly (and therefore undistributed), and in negative propositions, the predicate is always taken universally (and therefore distributed).

Distributed Terms:

A Statement- Universal Affirmative	All	S	is	P
E Statement- Universal Negative	No	S	is	P
I Statement- Particular Affirmative	Some	S	is	P
A Statement- Universal Affirmative	Some	S	is not	P

Logic II

Disjunctive Syllogisms

A syllogism that contains a disjunctive statement as its major premise, a categorical statement affirming or denying one of the elements of the conditional statement as its minor premise, and a categorical statement affirming or denying one of the elements of the major premise as the conclusion.

Disjunctive Statements:

Either ... or

Either Jesus is a man or Jesus is God.

Moods of Disjunctive Syllogisms:

Tollendo Ponens
(Affirmation by denial)

Ponendo Tollens
(Denial by affirmation)

Disjunctive syllogisms are valid when they affirm by denying, but are not valid when they deny by affirming.
