Academic Update:

Reading – Concept: -ch or -tch at the end of a word – Week 2

1 syllable, 1 short vowel, one /ch/ sound at the end of the word right after the vowel = write -tch

Math –Lesson 15 – Making 10 (1+9; 9+1, 2+8; 8+2; 3+7; 7+3; 4+6; 6+4; 5+5)

Literature – Billy and Blaze – Week 1

English – Start Chapter 7 – Prepositional Phrases

Science – Transportation Unit: Trains
