What we're learning...

~ The two voices in Latin are active and passive; in the active voice, the subject performs the action of the verb; in the passive voice, the subject receives the action of the verb

~ To conjugate in the passive voice, simply add passive endings to the stem in the place of active endings

What we're learning...

- ~ -er nouns of the 2nd declension
- ~ Finding the stem of an -er noun is the same as any noun: go to the genitive singular and drop the genitive singular ending
- ~ Some -er nouns of the 2nd declension retain the "e" in the stem, and some drop the "e" in the stem

What we're learning...

- ~ Decimals work in the base ten system
- ~ When Subtracting decimals, the decimal point in each addend must be lined up before adding
- ~ Lining up the decimal number ensures that digits with the same place value (ones, tenths, hundredths) are lined up vertically so we are adding digits with the same place value together
