

- \sim -er nouns of the 2^{nd} declension
- ~ Finding the stem of an -er noun is the same as any noun: go to the genitive singular and drop the genitive singular ending
- ~ Declining with 2^{nd} declension -er nouns is done exactly the same as with 2^{nd} declension -us or -um nouns

- ~ Decimals work in the base ten system
- ~ When Subtracting decimals, the decimal point in each addend must be lined up before adding
- ~ Lining up the decimal number ensures that digits with the same place value (ones, tenths, hundredths) are lined up vertically so we are adding digits with the same place value together
