We watched a short video of the Christmas folktale, *The Three Trees*, about an oak, pine, and olive tree who have dreams of being used for a grand purpose one day: one becomes the manger for baby Jesus; one is built and used as a boat that carries Jesus and His disciples; and one becomes the cross upon which Jesus dies for us.
