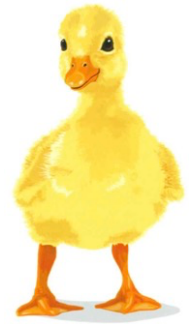

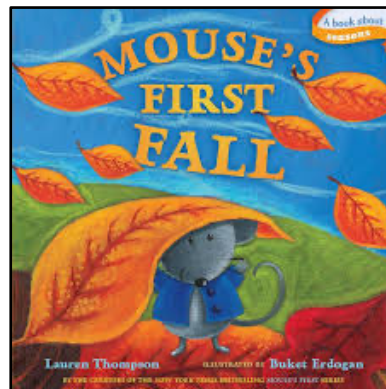

**Reformation Day, October 31<sup>st</sup>, commemorates when Martin Luther nailed his Ninety-Five Theses on the door of the Castle Church in Wittenberg, Germany in 1517.** He wanted to take part in an academic debate, protesting the Catholic church's practice of indulgences. He opposed the view that salvation from our sins could be bought, pointing to the truth of the Bible, that faith and salvation is only through Jesus' blood shed on the cross (Ephesians 2:8-9), not able to be purchase or earned. Many other reformers began sharing the truth of God's Word, opening the discussion about the Bible. Because it was now easier to print the Bible in the common language of the people, many ideas were spread far and wide. Other reformers were Martin Brucer (1491-1551) a Protestant, John Calvin (1509-1564) a French theologian, Thomas Cranmer (1486-1541) was part of the English reformation, John Knox (1513-1572) was an Anglican reformer, and Pierre Viret (1511-1571) was a Swiss reformer. **Lutherans teach grace alone, faith alone, and Scripture alone.**
