In history we learned about Nebuchadnezzar II and the Babylonian captivity of Judah. In reading, they learned about the Picnic Chicken Basket rule, which tells when to use the letter c, ck, or k for the /k/ sound in the middle of a word. In science, they finished out the unit on Aristotle and his views of the world around him. We have some exciting experiments to look forward to in our next unit!
