Traffic Flow:

- DRIVE SLOWLY ON CAMPUS!
- Follow the signs on campus (same procedure as last year). All traffic for morning arrival and afternoon dismissal will be **one-way**.
- ECE through Gr.2 traffic will stay in the right hand lane and proceed to the ECE building (Carline 2).
- Grades 3-8 will stay in the left hand lane and proceed to the drop-off area following the cones (Carline 1).

!! When you exit campus during high traffic arrival and dismissal hours, you must TURN RIGHT on Tidwell and use the U turn, if needed. This will allow traffic to flow much more quickly as we leave campus. !!

Morning Arrival & Afternoon Dismissal

MORNING:

- Drop Off ONLY in the carline areas. Please DO NOT pull up to the classroom building or portables. This will help to keep everyone safe and to keep traffic flowing smoothly on campus in the morning.

- Help to keep the line moving efficiently by having backpacks, lunches, and water bottles close by for a quick exit from the car!

AFTERNOON:

- Use assigned carlines as printed on green or pink car sign or as listed in Pikmykid.
- Parents should remain in cars and allow staff to support loading.
- Carline must be used - no walkups as this creates a safety issue.
- We ask that parents pull around to the church parking area to finish buckling children in car seats in order to keep lines moving efficiently.

Once carline is finished (and the time is after 3:30pm) all remaining scholars are moved to Extended Care. **Pick up for Extended Care is at the Early Childhood Center.**
