Hello 2nd grade family! It was so fun seeing so many of you at the OSL Camp Out! I hope a good time was had by all who attended.

Last week in science we made models of Aristotle's geocentric view of the solar system. In history we read about the rising of Athens and Sparta, and how pottery was used as a method of art as well as to record history. The scholars decorated clay pots to reflect what they learned. Both can be seen at the science/history fair tomorrow evening from 6:30 to 8:00!

We continued our novel, *The Courage of Sarah Noble*, and talked about what it means to be brave. In English we continued to classify sentences using the 7 parts of speech we have learned (noun, verb, adjective, adverb, preposition, pronoun, and conjunction). In Latin we are continuing numbers 1 through 10, as well as learning the Gloria Patri prayer. In religion, scholars go over the 66 books of the Bible daily and are continuing the unit on Jesus' public ministry.
