

"The Most Dangerous Game" by Richard Connell



Logic I

There are Seven Rules for determining validity in a Syllogism. They are divided into Three categories:

Terminological Rules

1. There must be Three and Only Three Terms.
2. The Middle Term must not occur in the Conclusion.

Quantitative Rules

3. If a Term is Distributed in the Conclusion, then it must be Distributed in the Premise.
4. The Middle Term must be distributed at least once.

Qualitative Rules

5. No Conclusion can follow from two Negative Premises.
6. If the two Premises are affirmative, the Conclusion must also be affirmative.
7. If either Premise is Negative, the Conclusion must also be Negative.

Logic II

Dilemmas

The **simple constructive** dilemma

If P, then Q; and if R, then Q
Either P or R
Therefore, Q

The **simple destructive** dilemma

If P, then Q; and if P, then R
Either **not Q** or **not R**
Therefore, **not P**

The **complex constructive** dilemma

If P, then Q; and if R, then S
Either P or R
Therefore, either Q or S

The **complex destructive** dilemma

If P, then Q; and if R, then S
Either **not Q** or **not S**
Therefore, **not P** or **not R**
