

Romeo and Juliet by William Shakespeare


Romeo kills Tybalt after

The Seventh Graders are now looking at the Second Act of the Mind- Judgement. The Verbal Expression of Judgement is a **Proposition**. Propositions unite by affirming or separate by denying. Propositions must have a **Subject Term** and **Predicate term**. They must be connected by a **copula-** a linking verb.

Logic II

-Ch. 6 Enthymemes quiz Monday

A Logical Proposition needs: Subject, Predicate (*Noun*), Quantifier, Copula, ("be" verb- is, am, are, was, were).

To Translate an ordinary sentence into a categorical statement we need to follow specific rules:

- A. Clearly identify the Subject and Predicate of the English sentence.
- B. Supply the missing Quantifier
- C. Add the missing Complement
- D. Supply the missing Copula
- E. Change the *Exclusive* sentences into A Statements
- F. Change the *Negative* sentences into E or O Statements
- G. Change the *Exceptive* sentences into E or A Statements
- H. Sentences containing *anyone, anything, whoever, the, if...then, whatever* should be translated into A Statements
- I. Sentences containing someone, something, there is, there are should be translated into I Statements

An **Enthymeme** is a syllogism that does not contain both of the necessary premises - or contains both of its premises but is missing a conclusion.



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
