




Eighth Literature

Theseus does his best to praise the actors for their efforts; Hippolyta finds the play and the acting so bad it's uncomfortable. Lysander and Demetrius make sarcastic, funny comments throughout the whole play.



Oberon and Titania enter and bless the palace and its occupants with a fairy song, so that the lovers will always be true to one another, their children will be beautiful, and no harm will ever visit Theseus and Hippolyta. Puck makes a final address to the audience. He says that if the play has offended, the audience should remember it simply as a dream. Logic I

The Seventh Graders looked deeper into defining terms. We've discussed different types of definitions- Lexical, Precising, Stipulative, Theoretical, and Persuasive.

We also looked at ways to define terms: defining by synonym, defining by example, and defining by genus and species.

Logic II

The Eighth Graders looked at the Indirect Reduction that can be used to BAROCO and BOCARDO statements into BARBARA. We use the concept that in a valid syllogism, if the conclusion is false, one of the premises must be false. To do Indirect Reduction we use the contradiction of the Conclusion and the indicated Premise, then invert them.
