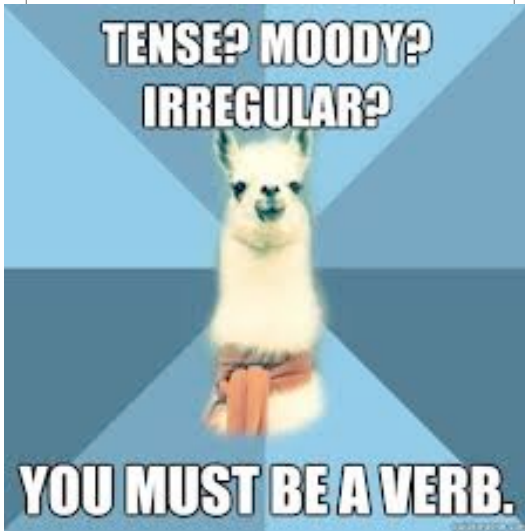

- * The Hobbit- This time-honored novel was a chance for the scholars to step into the “secondary world” of Middle Earth. Besides being a masterful story teller, J.R.R. Tolkien is an incredible wordsmith. The riddles, poems, and songs that we read in his work were just as important as the prose.
