How To Mark a Book

As noted before, scholars will be given their very own copy of *Julius Caesar*. This will give us a wonderful opportunity to engage even more deeply with our reading. Here are some basic instructions for engaging and marking in a book. I would encourage you to look in your child's book as we go along and then ask them questions about what they like or what they find interesting, etc.

- 1. Circle unfamiliar words
- 2. Box character names
- 3. Underline important passages
- 4. Put an * asterisk near main ideas or plot developments
- 5. Use a question mark to indicate confusing ideas or parts that need further questioning.
