### Grammar/ Literature

This week scholars will begin Chapter 6 in the Shurley English curriculum. We will be discussing and applying knowledge about pronouns. Pronouns help our writing become less repetitive.

In literature, we will look at the aftermath of the assassination of Julius Caesar. We will finally begin Act 4. Shakespeare's plays all follow a Chiastic structure (Acts 1 and 2 mirror Acts 4 and 5), so we will be able see the undoing of the alliances and, unfortunately for the Roman Republic, watch the rise of the Roman Empire.



### Not-So-Serious Shakespeare

You may have been hearing from the scholars that grade 6 will be performing a “Not-So-Serious Shakespeare” production of *Julius Caesar*. 
