The science fair projects are moving along. The hypothesis was due on Tuesday, January 23. Your child should have started their experiment by now. The next thing, the experiment steps and materials, is due Friday, February 2. Remember, I take off one point for each day the different steps are late. There is a schedule in their folders.

Re-enrolment began January 1. The registration fee for January is \$600.

Summer camp enrollment is for up to 4th grade. Sign up should start on January 15.

Reading- We are continuing to read The Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe. We will be going on a field trip to see the play of the book on Monday, February 5. There were 4 spots available for chaperones, but they have all been filled.

Math- We will be learning how to write numbers into standard notation. There will be a test on Friday.

English- The next chapter, Chapter 9, will be introduced to helping verbs and how to write quotations.
