1. Sanctification: an overview

- 3. The result and implications of positional sanctification
  - a. Eph 1:3-8 We are \_\_\_\_\_\_ and blessed with every spiritual blessing
  - b. Eph 1:5 We have been adopted into His family as sons
  - c. Eph 2:4, 5 We are alive to \_\_\_\_\_\_ things
  - d. 1 John 5:3-4 We have become victors over the world
  - e. 1 Cor 10:13 We have the ability to overcome any \_\_\_\_\_
  - f. Rom 6:4-22 Our sin nature is no longer in charge!
