

- 10. Arbitrary, haphazard







Appendix A

συνείδησις (syneidēsis): translated as 'conscience' in NT occurs 30x:

- 2x in Acts
- 20x in Paul's letters
- 5x in Hebrews
- 3x in 1 Peter

Note also the words appearing with 'conscience' in these verses (*italicized*).

- 1. **Acts 23:1** "And looking intently at the council, Paul said 'Brothers, I have lived my life before God in all *good* <u>conscience</u> up to this day."
- 2. **Acts 24:16** "So I always take pains to have a *clear* <u>conscience</u> toward both God and man."
- 3. **Romans 2:15** "They show that the work of the law is written on their hearts, while their conscience also *bears witness*, and their conflicting thoughts *accuse* or even *excuse* them."
- 4. **Romans 9:1** "I am speaking the truth in Christ I am not lying; my <u>conscience</u> *bears me witness* in the Holy Spirit."
- 5. **Romans 13:5** "Therefore one must be in subjection, not only to avoid God's wrath but also *for the sake of conscience*.
- 6. **1 Corinthians 8:7** "However, not all possess this knowledge. But some, through former association with idols, eat food as really offered to an idol, and their <u>conscience</u>, being *weak*, is *defiled*."
- 7. **1 Corinthians 8:10** "For if anyone sees you who have knowledge eating in an idol's temple, will he not be *encouraged*, if his <u>conscience</u> is *weak*, to eat food offered to idols?"
- 8. **1 Corinthians 8:12** "Thus, sinning against your brothers and wounding their conscience when it is weak, you sin against Christ."
- 9-10. **1 Corinthians 10:25, 27** "Eat whatever is sold in the meat market without raising any question *on the ground of* conscience...If one of the unbelievers invites you to dinner and you are disposed to go, eat whatever is set before you without raising any question *on the ground of* conscience."
- 11-13. **1 Corinthians 10:28-29** "But if someone says you, 'This has been offered in sacrifice,' then do not eat it, *for the sake of* the one who informed you, and for the sake of



<u>conscience</u> - I do not mean your <u>conscience</u>, but his. For why should my liberty be *determined* by someone else's <u>conscience</u>?"

- 14. **2 Corinthians 1:12** "For our boast is this, the *testimony* of our <u>conscience</u>, that we behaved in the world with simplicity and godly sincerity, not by earthly wisdom but by the grace of God, and supremely so toward you."
- 15. **2 Corinthians 4:2** "But we have renounced disgraceful, underhanded ways. We refuse to practice cunning or to tamper with God's word, but by the open statement of the truth we would *commend ourselves* to everyone's <u>conscience</u> in the sight of God."
- 16. **2 Corinthians 5:11** "Therefore, knowing the fear of the Lord, we persuade others. But what we are is known to God, and I hope it is *known* also to your <u>conscience</u>.
- 17. **1 Timothy 1:5** "The aim of our charge is love that issues from a pure heart and a *good* conscience and a sincere faith."
- 18. **1 Timothy 1:19** "... holding faith and a *good* <u>conscience</u>. By rejecting this, some have made shipwreck of their faith."
- 19. **1 Timothy 3:9** "They must hold the mystery of the faith with a *clear* <u>conscience</u>.
- 20. **1 Timothy 4:2** ".. through the insincerity of liars whose <u>consciences</u> are *seared*."
- 21. **2 Timothy 1:3** "I thank God whom I serve, as did my ancestors, with a *clear* <u>conscience</u>, as I remember you constantly in my prayers night and day."
- 22. **Titus 1:15** "To the pure, all things are pure, but to the defiled and unbelieving, nothing is pure; but both their minds and their <u>consciences</u> are *defiled*."
- 23. **Hebrews 9:9b** "According to this arrangement, gifts and sacrifices are offered that cannot *perfect* the <u>conscience</u> the worshiper."
- 24. **Hebrews 9:14** "... how much more will the blood of Christ, who through the eternal Spirit offered himself without blemish to God, *purify* our <u>conscience</u> from dead works to serve the living God. "
- 25. **Hebrews 10:2** "Otherwise, would they not have ceased to be offered, since the worshipers, having once been cleansed, would no longer *have* any <u>consciousness</u> of sins?"

(This is the first of two times in the New Testament that syneidēsis means merely "consciousness" (in the sense of "awareness") rather than moral consciousness" or "conscience.")



- 26. **Hebrews 10:22** "... let us draw near with a true heart in full assurance of faith, with our hearts sprinkled clean from an *evil* conscience and our bodies washed with pure water."
- 27. **Hebrews 13:18** "Pray for us, for we are sure that we have a *clear* <u>conscience</u>, desiring to act honorably in all things."
- 28. **1 Peter 2:19** "For this is a gracious thing, when, <u>mindful</u> [NIV: 'conscious] of God, one endures sorrows while suffering unjustly."

(The second of the two times in the New Testament that syneidēsis means merely "consciousness" (in the sense of "awareness") rather than "moral consciousness" or "conscience.")

- 29. **1 Peter 3:16** "...having a *good* <u>conscience</u>, so that, when you are slandered, those who revile your good behavior in Christ may be put to shame."
- 30. **1 Peter 3:21** "Baptism, which corresponds to this, now saves you, not as a removal of dirt from the body but as an appeal to God for a *good* <u>conscience</u>, through the resurrection of Jesus Christ."
