Look to Live • Numbers 21:4-9

Read John 3:1-18

- 1. Maybe the most well-known verse in the Bible is John 3:16.
- 2. But few know it's context or setting.
- 3. It's this conversation Jesus had with a super-smart Jewish leader named Nicodemus.
- 3. And just 2 verses before v16, Jesus referred to a story out of Israel's history, using it as an example of what He came to do.
- 4. We're going to take a look at that story today in Numbers 21.

Vs4-5

- ⁴ Then they journeyed from Mount Hor by the Way of the Red Sea, to go <u>around</u> the land of Edom; & the soul of the people <u>became very discouraged</u> on the way. ⁵ And the people spoke against God & against Moses: "Why have you brought us up out of Egypt to die in the wilderness? For *there is* no food & no water, & our soul loathes this worthless bread."
- 1. The yrs of wandering round the wilderness are soon ending.
- 2. Israel is once again back at the S'n border of Canaan where they balked at entering the PL some 38yrs before.
- 3. But they won't be entering from the S.
 - a. They'll enter from the E across the Jordan River into the ctr of Canaan.
 - b. To get there, they have to go round the region of Edom, relatives of Israel.
 - c. God doesn't want them messing with them, so He takes them on a detour around them.
 - d. But that means travelling thru some of the dreariest landscape in the Sinai Peninsula.
 - e. During which, the they slide into a deep funk.
- 4. Check it out: This is just weeks away from their entering the PL.
 - a. The gen that had balked at entering nearly 4 decades before *is gone*.
 - b. This new gen has mostly been *raised* in the wilderness.
 - c. And ALL their lives they've known they were on a mission
 - 1) A journey, not just thru territory, but in mental & spiritual preparation to enter Canaan;
 - 2) To take possession of what their parents had been too freaked out to go for.
 - d. They want to get at it.
 - e. They're *tired* of trudging thru a dreary wilderness & start up the whining all over again.
 - f. Yep: Their complainer-parents were dead & buried, but they'd left **this mark** on their kids.
 - g. But whereas their parents had groused at Moses, these ramp it up to include God Himself!
 - 1) "We're hungry! We're thirsty! And we're soooo over manna!"
 - 2) It wasn't that they didn't have food & drink. God provided for them miraculously.
 - 3) They were just **bored** with His provision.
 - 4) They wanted to be IN the PL NOW & groused yet again about how God was getting them there.
- 5. We need to pause at this point & draw an important lesson from this.
 - a. There is a Destiny in Glory God has for each and every one of us in Christ.
 - b. But it's the journey *He's ordained for us* that makes us into the person we need to be to enter that glory.
 - c. The destination is the result of the journey.
 - d. There's no getting there apart from faithfully taking each individual step.
 - e. And that's why God rarely shows us the ultimate goal.
 - f. What He does show us is just the next step.
 - g. See, if we saw the end, we'd devise out own plan a & path from where we are today, to there.
 - h. We'd take the shortcuts the devil suggests.
 - i. What we have to keep in mind is that our Destiny in Christ is the result, the fruit of the God-directed and ordained steps leading there.
- 6. Think about Israel at this point: They just want to go into Canaan; The Promise their Destiny.
 - a. And if they had their way, they'd press in right now.
 - b. The problem is: They weren't ready! And this grousing they now break out in PROVES it.
 - c. People who whine about food & drink can't slay giants & lay siege to fortresses.

- d. People who fall apart at breaking a nail aren't going to do well in the octagon.
- e. This and some of the things they are about to go throu proive they just aren't ready to enter Canaan and effectively deal with it's challenges.
- 7. Christian: Trust the plan and path God has you on. Don't get ahead of Him. Don't take shortcuts.
 - a. There **IS** NO shortcut to glory; no quick & easy route to the holiness that glory means.
 - b. Trust the Spirit to guide you in each step. Be faithful TODAY, and let tomorrow come in it's time.
 - c. That's a word for some of you today. [Share // Mission men]

V6

- 1. What happens next is a severe discipline.
- 2. There's simply no way to soften this; it's hard.
- 3. So before we read it, let's settle something: Is God ever unjust?
 - a. Does He ever go over-board? Yes! But only in His love with mercy & grace.
 - b. When God *must* mete out discipline on His wayward, erring kids, He's *never-ever* abusive.
 - c. Keep that in mind as we read

⁶So the Lord sent fiery serpents among the people, & they bit the people; & many of the people of Israel died.

- 4. 'Fiery' refers to the *color* of these snakes.
 - a. This area they're in is a habitat of all kinds of reptiles.
 - b. The Bedouin who travel here avoid it because of the many venomous snakes.
- 5. As Israel traversed this region, bitterly complaining against God, their camp was infested with snakes.
- 6. Why? Why THIS discipline? Let's answer it this way ...
- 7. Most parents have a special form of communication they learned from *their* parents called "Parentese."
 - a. Even if you aren't a parent, you probably know it.
 - b. I'll say the 1st part of a parental phrase; you complete it.
 - 1) This is going to hurt me –
 - 2) Eat your dinner. Don't you know there are –
 - 3) Mom says, "Just wait till -"
 - 4) Well, if someone told you to jump off –
 - 5) Do you think that money grows –
 - 6) Your room looks like a –
 - 7) Close the door! Were you –
 - 8) Don't run with scissors. You could poke –
 - c. Let's bring that all back to this ch in Israel's story & remember what a parent says when a child's just being a spoiled brat & is unreasonably whining & complaining.
 - d. That parent will often say, "If you don't quit your crying, I'll give you **Something to cry about**."
- 8. Israel's complaint here is utterly unreasonable.
 - a. Whining about a daily diet of the miraculous??!!??!?!?! Come on: We all recognize that's ridiculous.
 - b. So God allowed these venomous snakes to infest their camp to show them what things are like when He's NOT preserving & providing for them.
 - c. You wanna complain? Okay here's something to REALLY complain about: Snakeapalozza! Serpentnado!
 - d. You've heard of the **Burning Man** festival held in the Nevada desert every Summer? This was the **Fiery Snake Festival**.
- 9. God issues Israel a serious "wake-up call" about their attitude.
 - a. Maybe the scenery isn't the most cheery, & yes, their diet was bland.
 - b. But for 40 yrs God has a *flawless record of faithfulness* in providing for them.
 - c. All they need to do is hang on a little longer and the PL will be theirs.
 - d. All that was keeping them OUT at this point was **THIS** silly habit of complaining they'd picked up from their parents.
 - e. Let's not miss the lesson here: These snakes **proved** they weren't ready to enter Canaan.
 - f. They came to rid Israel of it's bad 'tude.
- 10. They learned their **attitude** was **less** a matter of their **circumstances** & **more** a matter of their **faith**.
- 11. They realized that truth by what happens next ...

⁷ Therefore the people came to Moses, & said, "We have sinned, for we have spoken against the Lord & against you; pray to the Lord that He take away the serpents from us." So Moses prayed for the people. ⁸ Then the Lord said to Moses, "Make a fiery *serpent*, & set it on a pole; & it shall be that everyone who is bitten, when he looks at it, shall live." ⁹ So Moses made a bronze serpent, & put it on a pole; & so it was, if a serpent had bitten anyone, when he looked at the bronze serpent, he lived.

- 1. Note that God didn't take the serpents out of the camp.
 - a. No Pied Piper arrived to whistle them away.
 - b. God devised a different remedy that moved the people to realize the problem lay with them not God.
- 2. He told Moses to raise a pole high over the camp of Israel bearing a likeness of 1 of the snakes.
- 3. Anyone bitten just had to turn their eyes on it to be healed.
- 4. God made this remedy to the challenge of the snakes as a *crucial moment of decision* for the people of Israel.
- 6. Remember; not long after this, they enter Canaan.
 - a. A few of the seniors who'd left Egypt are still alive.
 - b. They are their whining slave mentality are still polluting the mindset of Israel.
 - c. Their faithlessness needs to die off.
 - d. Some of the younger generation taken up their faithless mantle of unbelief. They too must quit the camp.
 - e. Only Faith can lay hold of God's Promise.
- 7. Listen: There's no *natural* remedy for a poisonous snakebite in looking at a bronze replica of a snake.
 - a. If you go hiking in the hills above Ojai and get bit by a rattlesnake,
 - b. The remedy is a dose of antivenom, not whipping out your cellphone & Googling a picture of a snake.
 - c. In this case, that was **precisely** the remedy!
- 8. The people needed desperately to realize their problem wasn't the natural realm of scenery, food or drink.
- 9. Theirs was a spiritual problem only a supernatural solution could remedy.
- 10. They needed to TRUST GOD. The way to demonstrate that trust was by simply doing something that seemed to have no connection to being healed: Look up! Look to the remedy God's provided!
 - a. Those who took God at His word and promise looked and were healed.
 - b. Those who heard of the remedy but said, "How can looking at a bronze serpent on a pole heal me? That's absurd" Died!
 - c. Needlessly! Foolishly! All they needed to do was look.
 - d. But oh, how smug & superior they felt in their refusal to look as they perished.

Application

- 1. As do millions today, bitten & dying by the fiery serpent of sin.
- 2. All they need to do is look to Christ who was lifted up on the Cross to die for them.
- 3. As Paul says in 2 Cor. 5:21

God made Him who knew no sin to be sin for us, that we might become the righteousness of God in Him.

- 4. All people need to do to Live is to Look to Jesus.
- 5. But as even He said, MOST don't & won't.
 - a. Though bitten & dying, they pretend everything's fine.
 - b. They're *offended* by the thought they're perishing, even as their sin consumes them.
 - c. They refuse to accept that the Cross is the remedy for their brokenness.
- 6. If that's you this morning, we who've looked to Jesus plead with you to do the same.
 - a. A moment ago as we considered those in this story who refused to look at the raised serpent,
 - b. You rightly assigned them the label of foolish rebel. Don't repeat their error.
 - c. Right now: Look to Jesus and Live!
- 12. Look to Him now & live.
