THE WAY DOWNWARD: THE WAY OF BALAAM

Scripture Setting

Jude (KJV)

Key Verse

""Woe unto them! for they ... ran greedily after the error of Balaam for reward" (v. 11).

Who Was Balaam?

Numbers 22

His Name

"According to a Hebraic source, the name means, "swallowing up the people, destroyer of people."

His Origins

- We are first introduced to Balaam in Numbers 22.
- His father was Beor of Pethor.
- Evidence shows that he knew Israel's God (v. 8).
- Scripture suggests that he was well known to King Balak because Pethor was situated near Balak's homeland, and so Balak would have known him as a soothsayer (Num. 22:5).

His Character

 Balaam's character was questionable. On one side of his character, he presented himself as being obedient and submissive to God's will. Contrast this Numbers version of Balaam with the character described in Deuteronomy 23:5, Joshua 24:10, and Nehemiah 13:2.

<u>Deut. 23:5.</u> "Nevertheless the Lord thy God would not hearken unto Balaam; but the Lord thy God turned the curse into a blessing unto thee, because the Lord thy God loved thee."

Joshua 24:10. "But I would not hearken unto Balaam; therefore he blessed you still: so I delivered you out of his hand."

Nehemiah 13:2. "Because they met not the children of Israel with bread and with water, but hired Balaam against them, that he should curse them: howbeit our God turned the curse into a blessing."

Balaam's Greed

- Numbers 22 does not tell us whether Balaam accepted the reward or not.
- However, Jude 11 infers that he did, "... and ran greedily after the error of Balaam for reward."
- Peter concurs: "Which have forsaken the right way, and are gone astray, following the way of Balaam the son of Bosor, who loved the wages of unrighteousness"; 16But was rebuked for his iniquity: the dumb ass speaking with man's voice forbad the madness of the prophet" (2 Pet. 2:15-16).

God's Anger Against Balaam

Why was God angry with Balaam?

Numbers 22:20-21

"And God came unto Balaam at night, and said unto him, If the men come to call thee, rise up, and go with them; but yet the word which I shall say unto thee, that shalt thou do.

21 And Balaam rose up in the morning, and saddled his ass, and went with the princes of Moab."

• Peter referred to Balaam's "madness" (2 Pet.2:16). What did he mean by that? (Num. 22: 20-22 & 32.)

20 And God came unto Balaam at night, and said unto him, If the men come to call thee, rise up, and go with them; but yet the word which I shall say unto thee, that shalt thou do.

21 And Balaam rose up in the morning, and saddled his ass, and went with the princes of Moab. And God's anger was kindled <u>because</u> he went:

32 And the angel of the Lord said unto him, Wherefore hast thou smitten thine ass these three times? behold, I went out to withstand thee, because thy way is perverse before me:

• Balaam's Perverse Way

The KJV Dictionary defines perverse as:

- 1. Literally, turned aside; hence, distorted from the right.
- 2. Obstinate in the wrong; disposed to be contrary; stubborn; intractable.

• Balaam was indeed perverse. From the beginning, God had told him explicitly, "Thou shalt not go with them; thou shalt not curse the people: for they are blessed" (v. 6).

Merchandizing Gifts

- Balaam had a gift. He knew God and God spoke to and thru him. However, he used his gift for financial gain.
- We must be careful that we are not motivated by greed. Rather, we must use our gift to serve others (1 Pet. 4:10-11).

His Doctrine

The Real Balaam

- Balaam painted an exemplary picture of himself,
 yet his actions exposed his underhandedness.
- Revelations 2: 14, "But I have a few things against thee, because thou hast there them that hold the doctrine of Balaam, who taught Balac to cast a stumblingblock before the children of Israel, to eat things sacrificed unto idols, and to commit fornication."
- What was Balaam's doctrine? His doctrine could be called the Principles of Betrayal. (See also Numbers 31:16)
