# Luke 18:1-34 – 30 July 2023 "Will Jesus Find Faith In You?"

## **Introduction**

- \*From Chap 10-19a until they enter Jerusalem, Jesus' messages have a time urgency to them
- \*In Chap 17:20, Pharisees interrupted w/ a demand of to know when the Kingdom would could
- \*Jesus then taught His disciples to stay vigilant with an urgency to always be ready
- \*In Chap 18, every account is related to driving deeper into our trust and faith in God
- \*Not just do we have a base-level of faith but...
  - \*Are we driving deeper into the details?
  - \*Are we trusting God is ALL areas of our life?
- \*When He returns, 'Will Jesus find faith in you?'

# So today, let's look at 4 ways to check if your faith is continually deepening

## #1 - Are we persisting in prayer? (Vs 1-8)

### Read Vs 1

- 1. Two qualities to this word 'always'
  - a. Lines of communication always open unblocked by sin (Read Isa 59:2)
  - b. Communications never cease until God answers (Read Rom 12:12)
- 2. Trained on radio language for the military
  - a. 'Over' means "I have finished speaking for the moment, but I'm expecting your reply"
  - b. 'Out' means "I have finished speaking and the conversation is finished, don't reply"
  - c. We always end our prayers with "over"

## Read Vs 2-5

- 1. So this judge isn't interested in morality or even humanity, just himself
  - a. Even just for this selfish reason he will help
- 2. Notice this woman in affliction doesn't turn another way

- a. She doesn't turn to crime to avenge herself
- b. She doesn't give up and suffer loss
- c. She simply persists the right way

#### Read Vs 6-7

- 1. It's not that God will <u>answer</u>, it's that God will <u>avenge</u> when we have persistent faith in Him
- 2. We're often not receiving for 3 reasons
  - a. #1: B/c we're telling God <u>how</u> to answer and not simply <u>what</u> needs answered
  - b. #2: B/c we're asking for something *selfish*, instead of something *just* (Read Jam 4:3)
  - c. #3: B/c we're living in sin otherwise (Read Jam 5:16)

### Read Vs 8

- 1. Notice God "will" avenge them
- 2. Leave the 'making it right' part up to God
- 3. Our part is to remain faithful believing that He will (make it right)
- 4. It's like a kid getting to sit in front seat of the car for the 1<sup>st</sup> time thinking dad needs help driving

# #2 – Are we decreasing while Jesus is increasing? (Vs 9-14)

#### Read Vs 9-12

- 1. The Pharisee trusted himself
- 2. Doesn't need faith in God, he has faith in self
  - a. It's not that he doesn't have faith, it's that placement & substance of his faith is all wrong
  - b. Read John 3:30 Not worthy but He is
- 3. Faith in self is a wrong view of our goodness

#### Read Vs 13

- 1. This tax collector was believing that God alone could make him righteous by his mercy
- 2. This isn't <u>sad suicide</u>, this is <u>hopeful humility</u>

#### Read Vs 14

- 1. Righteousness comes when we accept 2 things
  - a. Our worthlessness
  - b. God's willingness to give it to the worthless
- 2. Just how valuable is Jesus to you?

## #3 – Are we coming toward Jesus? (Vs 15-30)

#### Read Vs 15-17

- 1. The Kingdom consists of people that what?
  - a. Have *child-like faith* to come to Jesus
  - b. Have *nothing to offer* Jesus but themselves
- 2. In fact the weaker we are, then the easier it is for Jesus to be glorified when great things happen!

#### Read Vs 18-19

- 1. First thing Jesus does is correct his understanding of 'good'
- 2. He's not saying that He's not good, but He simply needs the man to understand what good is
  - a. Good is morally perfect and pure

#### Read Vs 20-21

- 1. So Jesus points him to the 2<sup>nd</sup> half of the law regarding man & he says he's good to go
  - a. Rather than arguing finer points here, Jesus presses further into the Law about God Himself

#### Read Vs 22-23

- 1. 1<sup>st</sup> half of Law was designed to say, Love God above ALL ELSE
- 2. Jesus puts His finger on this man's true god (which is money)
  - a. Not that we all have to sell everything
  - b. He's trusting his money not trusting God
  - c. In a bind, what or whom do you 1st turn to?

#### Read Vs 24-25

- 1. It's not hard for this camel, it's impossible
- 2. Being rich is a relative term, so we know Jesus means one who trusts in his riches instead of trusting God

### Read Vs 26-30

- 1. Peter thinks the main point is selling possessions, but it's not (he's thinking earthly)
- 2. Jesus isn't asking us to <u>transfer our possessions</u>, He's asking us to <u>transfer our dependency</u>

## #4 – Are we choosing God's will? (Vs 31-34)

#### Read Vs 31

- 1. At that pause they're thinking great things! Read Vs 32-34
  - 1. Since they didn't want to accept a hard path, even the simple idea of talking in the 3<sup>rd</sup> person threw them off from understanding this message
  - 2. You say, but how does dying and rising accomplish God's plan all along?
    - a. Read Hos 13:14 (ie Gen 22, Lev 14)
    - b. How did they think He was to fulfill Hosea?
  - 3. Jesus said the way up is the way down (Read Mar 10:44-45)
    - a. You can't even make an omelet without breaking some eggs
    - b. Following God's path isn't always the easy path, but it always accomplishes great things

# Conclusion

In conclusion, <u>trusting Christ in death</u> gains us salvation, but <u>trusting Christ in life</u> is great blessing

## 1. Are you persisting in prayer?

- a. We will if we believe He's powerful
- b. This is the path to victory

## 2. Are you decreasing while Jesus is increasing?

## 3. Are you coming to Jesus?

- a. We will if we believe He's a kind father
- b. This is the path of blessing

## 4. Are you choosing God's will?

- a. We will if we believe He's our destiny
- b. This is the path of life
