Psalms 90-93 – 6 July 2025 "In God We Dwell"

Introduction

- *This is 1st of 6 messages in the 4th Book of Psalms
- *Psalms the Israeli Hymnbook or Book of Praises
- *Most of the 34 Psalms that have no title or introduction are clustered here in Book 4
- *Isn't it wonderful living a life under the will of God
- *Today's Psalms point us to just how wonderful it is
- *So today we'll see 3 benefits to truly dwelling in the presence of God – In God We Dwell

#1: Submitting to God brings meaning to our short, frail life (Psm 90)

Intro – This is the only Psalm attributed to Moses

Read Psm 90:1-2

- 1. Moses begins w/ humility calling Him Master
- 2. God has been Israel's home & refuge

- a. Their place of rest, security & protection
- 3. There's a trust that having this home will last
- 4. Now in vs 2, there's also an assurance of God's powerful position to maintain Himself
 - a. He's from the beginning until the very end
 - b. Literally from the vanishing point past to the vanishing point future

Read Vs 3-6

- 1. As contrasted w/ God, man is but for a moment
 - a. We came from the dust of the earth & that's where we return
 - b. We're like the grass, rising in the morning only to dry up in the evening
- 2. Peter borrowed this language about time
 - a. Not comparing 1000 yrs to a day (ie II Pet); here it's compared to a watch or 3 hrs
 - b. Time is just something God created for man to experience & live within
 - c. God is beyond it; watching men come & go

Read Vs 7-9

1. In relation to God, our sin nature makes this life dismal, deficient, & declining

2. He's painting a picture as to why it's wonderful God is willing to be our dwelling place or refuge

Read Vs 10-12

- 1. We're here for such a short time, we should realize that & not waste it
- 2. So how do we gain wisdom (Read Prov 9:10)
 - a. Begins w/ living under our Lord Jesus
- 3. To labor is vanity unless we're laboring to love God Himself

Read Vs 13-17

- 1. Yes our sins lead to despair, but we can pray our God will be gracious to us
 - a. Ask God to come & show pity (vs 13)
 - b. Ask God to rejoice our hearts w/ love (vs 14)
 - c. Ask God for years to experience Him (vs 15)
 - d. Ask God to see His action among us (vs 16)
 - e. Ask God to make firm our work for Him (Vs 17)
- 2. God delights to do good for his kids

#2: Submitting to God brings protection from worldly dangers (Psm 91)

Intro – Many, like Spurgeon, have found this Psalm the most cheerful of all the Psalms

Read Psm 91:1-2

- 1. If Psm 90 was a house to live in, this is a home
 - a. A hiding place of shelter from evil & trial
 - b. Secret place of refuge & hope for rejuvenation
- 2. Notice, the author uses 4 terms for the Lord here emphasizing His greatness
 - a. Most High God, Almighty, Yahweh, God
 - b. This is the God that has power to provide

Read Vs 3-4

- 1. This is the place of dependance & trust
 - a. Place that instills hope for a good future
- 2. Do you know how to abide in this secret place?
 - a. Susanna Wesley (19 kids); known to throw her apron over her head to signal she's w/ God
 - b. Paul & Silas were there while in prison

- 3. Shelters of this world come and go
 - a. My childhood home was just destroyed by fire a few days ago (7/1/2025)
 - b. Reminds you to place your hope in the Lord
- 4. May be chaos all around, but great peace within

Read Vs 5-8

- 1. Now is given the difference; there is the wicked & those that abide (live) under Jesus Christ
 - a. Those are great promises...to those that trust God, live under his house rules & love Him
 - b. Wes Bentley, a Calvary Missionary, serves in 39 of the most dangerous countries
 - i. Msg from July 12, 2020 stressed benefits of living under the shadow of God's wings
 - ii. "My obedience has protected me"
- 2. So who can claim these promises?
 - a. Let not the wicked man attempt it
 - b. Let not the carnal believer attempt it
 - c. Neither let the believer tempt the Lord in advance to prove these things to him
 - d. These are for believers living in His will

Read Vs 9-10

- 1. There is evil & plagues that come on people <u>b/c</u> they live according to the world's standards
 - a. Suffering from car wrecks b/c of drunkenness
 - b. Suffering from plagues b/c of illicit sex
- 2. Not for those who have pitched their tent within the Lord's boundaries

Read Vs 11-13

- 1. Satan tempted Jesus to use this as a pride
 - a. These promises are protective, not proactive
- 2. Like protection described in Mark 16:18 about taking up snakes
 - a. It's protective participation, not proactive operation
 - b. Paul would take God's protection in Act 28

Read Vs 14-16

- 1. From vs 14, our love of God is what protects
- 2. How do we know if someone loves God?
 - a. Read John 14:23 Obedience protects us

#3: Submitting to God brings hope to the thankful heart (Psm 92)

Intro – Let this Psalm be a reminder that the Sabbath for Israel was intended to be a delight, not a burden

Our Sabbath is living in Christ (Col 2:17)

Living for Christ should be a delight, not a burden Read Psm 92:1-4

- 1. It's good to praise & thank God in many ways
- 2. We thank Him for His works what He's done
 - a. We thank God for who He is, but do we also thank God just as much for what He does & how He does it?

Read Vs 5-9

- 1. This is as close to heaven as the wicked will get; & this is as close to hell as the faithful will get
- 2. When we see the wicked prosper, we need to consider the big plans God is orchestrating behind the scenes

Read Vs 10-11

- 1. Wild Ox is <u>re'em</u> translated unicorn
 - a. This is an extinct ox or rhino
 - b. Indian rhino is called *rhinoceros unicornis*
- 2. The Lord is given credit for giving strength & power with protection from enemies
- a. THESE are some of the great works of God Read Vs 12-15
 - 1. Notice again this flourishing is for those that are planted in the House of God
 - 2. This Psalm is for the one whose heart is drawn to worship the Lord for His wonderful works
 - a. THEN the blessing comes to them

And now, just for the fun of it, let's look at Psm 93 Be Glad That The Lord Reigns (Psm 93)

Intro – These short praise psalms need little to no interpretation even in the English

Read Vs 1-2

- 1. The Lord has all power & authority forever Read Vs 3-4
 - 1. As mighty at the created waves are, the Lord God that made them is much greater

Read Vs 5

- 1. Oh the great value of God's Word & presence
- 2. We can trust that our great God will always be the one true great God!

Conclusion

So, are you living your life subordinate to Christ?

- 1. It brings meaning to our short, frail life
- 2. It brings protection from worldly dangers
- 3. It brings hope to the thankful heart
