II Chronicles 8-9 – 6 November 2025 "A Chance To Magnify God"

Introduction

- *In II Chr 1-4, we began with Solomon's reign & his desire "To Work God's Will" in building the Temple
- *In II Chr 5-7, we saw the dedication of the Temple & the need to make Christ the centerpiece in all ways
- *Today we're given the final accounts of Solomon's life, with much expansion & opportunities to witness of God's greatness to others
- *How do we grow into making God known clearly, powerfully, effectively?

Today, we look at 3 methods for expanding the glory of God

#1 Method- Purity Powers Progress (Chap 8:1)

Read Vs 8:1-4

- 1. I Kings 9 says Solomon gave cities in Galilee to Hiram, but he didn't like them & gave back
- 2. Don't give away God's Promised Land
 - a. It's against Him Word & His plan
 - b. Impurity causes more work later
 - c. Solomon had to spend money to fix these camps once they were returned
 - d. Modern Israel is paying the price for giving the Gaza Strip to others in 2005

Read Vs 5-6

- 1. I Kings 9 also say that some of this building was fueled by contention with the Egyptian Pharaoh b/c of Solomon's marriage to his daughter
- 2. Impurity of his marriage delays God's work

Read Vs 7-10

1. Israelites were paid for their hard service to the central government

- 2. Canaanites put under tribute to pay & serve
 - a. More compromise Israel was told to wipe out these sinful Canaanites
- b. This impurity causes trouble for many years Read Vs 11
- He recognized her as unclean related to God's holy things, but what about unclean to his own life Read Vs 12-16
 - 1. All things of the Mosaic Law surrounding the yearly schedule of worship was implemented
 - 2. Solomon's mind was to honor God, but his flesh often fell into impurities

Read Vs 17-18

- 1. He had a great Red Sea navy obtaining gold
- 2. What would we use God's riches for?
 - a. Achan & Gehazi always lusted for more
 - b. Apostle Paul & Zacchaeus were willing to give it all away for service to God

#2 Method – Questioning Quells Quarrels (Chap 9:1-12)

Read Vs 9:1-4

- 1. I Kings' account says she came b/c she heard of Solomon regarding the name of the Lord
 - a. Solomon was known to give credit & promote the Lord
 - b. Very different account later with Hezekiah who brought the Babylonian to Jerusalem to brag of his own greatness (II Kings 20)
- 2. Solomon didn't brag of his possessions
 - a. He answered her questions & THEN she was impressed by seeing his possessions

Read Vs 5-8

- 1. Wisdom shouldn't lead to strife and envy, but to peace and joy
- 2. God's blessing led him into honor & respect by others

Read Vs 9-12

- 1. They mutually blessed each other & she left
- 2. What if we had a chance to learn from Solomon's wisdom and be blessed? Would we?
 - a. Read Matt 12:42
 - b. We can & should be asking Jesus questions
 - i. Not to challenge Him, but to gain wisdom

#3 Method – Prominence Provides Possibilities (Chap 9:13-31)

Read Vs 8:13-16

- 1. 25 tons of gold comes in every year
- 2. Many shields were made of the gold
- 3. We'll read later of Shishak, King of Egypt taking away the gold of Israel
 - a. In 1939 Shishak's mummy was found in Tanis, Egypt in an amazing gold-covered sarcophagus

Read Vs 17-19

1. Throne of ivory covered in gold decorated with lions

Read Vs 20-22

- 1. Egypt, Babylon & Assyria are all weak at this time, Greece is just beginning to rise
- 2. Israel is the jewel of the world

Read Vs 23-28

- 1. Solomon made Israel the center of the world's economic system
- 2. All b/c he asked for wisdom & God gave him wisdom, honor AND riches
- 3. God's path will always yield good results & vis versa

Now, it's at this point, the Chronicler skips the entire chapter of I Kings 11

- 1. Indicates all that Solomon did in turning his heart away from God
- 2. Our closest relationships, like Solomon, will steer our hearts toward or away from God
- 3. Don't allow our heart to make a convert of the mind
- 4. Smartest person in the world still has to crucify the flesh and be born again

Read Vs 29-31

- 1. This is typical conclusion to a king of Israel
- 2. Notice that there are other books written about 'Bible people', but that doesn't make those books 'Bible'
 - a. We have all that we need for life & godliness (II Pet 1:3)

So do we recognize these chances when we get them?

1. Purity Powers Progress

- a. Read Psm 24:3-5
- b. Jesus said, "Blessed are the pure in heart for they shall see God" (Matt 5:8)

2. Questioning Quells Quarrels

- a. If anyone lacks wisdom let him ask of God who will give to all
- b. Questioning draws us all closer together

3. Prominence Provides Possibilities

- a. God has given us all some resource or ability or influence
- b. Use it for the glory of God to make Him known and loved
