I Samuel 18-19 – 3 March 2022 "Dealing With Murderous Infighting & Envy"

Introduction

*3rd & final section of I Samuel (chaps 16-31) is about the preparation of David to take the earthly throne
*Rise of David over Saul (Anointing & Goliath) (16-17)
*Rejection of David in presence of Saul (18-19)
*Running of David away from Saul (20-31)
*David won't take the throne until II Samuel begins
*David is now receiving great acclaim for his

victories & King Saul is, frankly, jealous

*We face people & places of infighting & envy too
*Workplace, the Church, Clubs & Sports
*We have common goal, yet distracted into infighting

*Message is called "Dealing w/..." & it is murderous
*Jesus called hating w/o a cause murder of the heart
*We can murder relationship & missions by the very
words of our heart coming out

*Today we'll see 3 ways David dealt with murderous infighting & envy he received from King Saul

1st way to deal with infighting & envy is to be wise & content w/ your position (Vs 18:1-16)

Read Vs 1-2

- 1. Jonathan is attracted to David's friendship b/c of David's faith in God
 - a. This is the same Jonathan that we saw heroic acts of faith & bravery in battle from
- 2. Saul is interested in having David as a warrior

Read Vs 3-4

- 1. Jonathan believed David was the one worthy of his position as prince in Israel
- 2. Of all relationships that could have been filled with hate and envy, it's this one, but it's not!
 - a. They didn't envy each other's position, b/c they loved each other's mutual faith

Read Vs 5-9

- David proves that you don't need the throne to do great things for God
 - a. He was living to promote God's reputation

- 2. Saul proves that even with the throne you can still go terribly astray in deed
 - a. Saul was living for his own reputation
- 3. A godly reputation CAN make others jealous
 - a. David's just out there wisely doing his job, killing Philistines off of God's land
 - b. Not bothered if living for Jesus bugs others

Read Vs 10-11

- 1. This evil spirit was 'permitted' by the Lord
 - a. Covered this in chapter 16
 - b. Indicates that Saul 'pretended' to prophesy
- 2. Envious thoughts lead to envious actions
- 3. Notice David stuck around for the 2nd throw!
 - a. He's just contently doing his job!

Read Vs 12-16

- 1. Jealousy & fear of losing what you have, go together
- 2. For envy, Saul wouldn't allow David control of more than 1,000 men, though the people loved him
- 3. Yet David found contentment
 - a. You can be wise & content when you realize that God is with you!

2nd way to deal with infighting & envy is to behave w/ innocence & humility (Vs 18:17-30)

Read Vs 17-19

- 1. Saul was enticing David to go fight & die
 - a. Saul didn't want David as son-in-law, he wanted him dead
- 2. David was humbled at the offer but God wouldn't allow David to die in battle
 - a. Later parallels
 - i. David won't lay a hand on King Saul until God does
 - ii. David has Uriah killed in battle to gain Bathsheba
 - b. David's always ready to give Saul a 2nd chance at being nice always looking for good

Read Vs 20-21

- 1. Saul only gave Michal to David b/c he thought she would drag him down
- 2. David's simply looking for love & family

Read Vs 22-23

- 1. David hesitates to marry her b/c it seems presumptuous for him to marry into royalty
- 2. Notice the pattern here...
 - a. Saul's always stirring the pot
 - b. David's always trying to calm things down

Read Vs 24-27

- David w/ integrity went & fulfilled the ask b/c
 t'was w/i God's will, though Saul had bad intentions
- 2. Just simply live for God's will in simplicity
 - a. God will always allow only His goodness
 - b. It might look like Joseph of OT for a while
 - i. But what's meant for evil, God uses for good

Read Vs 28-29

Result of God's blessing: the godly fall in love
 w/ you & the ungodly hate you (Read Matt 10:34)

Read Vs 30

- 1. David knew how to handle all people
 - a. Harsh w/ enemy, simplicity w/ the godly

3rd way to deal with infighting & envy is to rely on your network of compatriots (Vs 19:1-24)

Read Vs 1 - First, David receives Jonathan's help

- 1. Saul is now openly calling for David to die
- Read Vs 2-3
 - 1. Jonathan wants to do reconnaissance for David
 - 2. He'll planning on interceding for David

Read Vs 4-5

- 1. Jonathan reminds Saul, David has done good
- 2. The flesh wants all people to either be your enemy or to be under you
- 3. The Spirit wants all people to be closer to God and promoted even above yourself
 - a. John the Baptist: "He must increase..."

Read Vs 6-7

- 1. Saul agrees to Jonathan not to kill David
- 2. Run by his emotions: Saul's having a good day

Read Vs 8-10

1. Saul has ups and down b/c he's not being controlled by the Holy Spirit but by his emotions

Read Vs 11-13 - 2nd now, David receives Michal's help

- 1. His wife Mical saves David from Saul at home
- 2. Interesting: the envious has to hid things

Read Vs 14-17

1. Michal even lies (not commended) to protect David from Saul – "he threatened to kill me!"

Read Vs 18-19 - *Finally now, David receives Samuel's help*

- 1. Where do you find refuge?
 - a. When Saul was running from God's call on him to be king, he hid from God in the carts
 - b. When David runs from evil Saul, he runs home, then towards men of God
- 2. The comfort of being with another man of God

Read Vs 20-24

- 1. 3 Sets of messengers and then Saul come to Samuel and David but just end up worshipping!
- 2. David will now be fleeing for rest of book
 - a. God's showing Saul: 'this is the experience that you could, should be having w/ Me'

Conclusion

Thru all the <u>infighting</u> & envy, David had his mind set on fulfilling the plan of God by destroying the enemies of God. He had an outward view of advancing God's glory, not an <u>inward pettiness</u>. How do you deal with it?

1. Be wise & content in your position

a. David knew that God would promote him in due time, just focus on the job at hand

2. Behave w/ innocence & humility

- a. Let's live in such a way that we're always wanting to give people the benefit of the doubt
- b. People trying to get you in trouble? Just live in simplicity of godliness

3. Rely on your network of compatriots

- a. We are here to bear each other's burdens when those overwhelming days come
- b. Have Godly friends you identify with that you can <u>run to</u>, that you can <u>text</u>, that you can <u>call</u>, that you can <u>hug</u>
