### I Timothy 1 – 31 December 2023 "Tactical Teaching"

#### Introduction

#### Read Vs 1

- 1. Acts records Paul's 3 Trips & imprisonment in Rome circa 63 AD
  - a. From this & his 2<sup>nd</sup> (final) imprisonment, little is known other than he wrote the Pastorals
- 2. Notice, in writing of 'how to shepherd sheep',Paul takes the title of Apostle b/c God told him toa. Otherwise often uses prisoner or servant
- 3. Paul is describing ONE great God here
  - a. He's Savior, Lord, Messiah & our hope
  - b. And He has a name...Jesus

Read Vs 2

- Timothy was closely involved w/ Paul starting w/ the 2<sup>nd</sup> Missionary Trip as we read in Acts 16
- 2. Timothy was in charge of the work at Ephesus
- 3. Notice from vs 2, Paul considered him a son
  - a. Need to have others we're pouring into

4. Paul adds to his typical greeting a note of mercy – Young men need to remember mercy

For those of you that enjoy outlines

- 1. Timothy's 6 chapters is outlined as TILDAS
  - a. Teaching, Intimacy, Leaders, Dangers, Aged, and Suspicions
  - b. 'Tilda' is French word from ancient Germanic for '*mighty in battle*' or '*mighty in strength*'
    - i. Key verse of the book (Read) I Tim 1:18

\*So today Paul opens with the importance of solid, simple standing on teaching the Word of God

## Today, we'll look at some ways of using true doctrine and simple teaching

# #1 – Highly value doctrine over the counterfeits(Vs 3-11)

Read Vs 3

 Paul asked & entrusted Tim to be his personal rep at Ephesus to ensure only good teaching is given
 a. Not easy for Tim to stay at Ephesus w/o Paul b. This is why Paul called God our Saviour in vs 1, b/c Caesar demanded to be called Savior
2. Paul warned Ephesian Elders before he left of false teachers springing up (Read Acts 20:28-30)
Read Vs 4

Doctrine – the substance of what you believe 1. Should be incredibly more important to us a. Charge: Don't allow others to spread lies b. Conversely there were unprovable tales being 2. told w/ no substance nor reason to fight w/ them No one can prove things <u>against</u> Jesus, they a. instead just want to distract you in the flesh World is always searching for new things, b. only to find discontentment and move on 3. Point of good teaching - build you up, (edify) not to leave you w/ more questions than answers

Read Vs 5

- 1. What we're pouring into each other should be from love for them, w/o ulterior motives
- Every word should be designed to help them w/ a Godly exchange of truisms from God's Word

Read Vs 6-7

- 1. There're some that are more interested in being seen as a teacher or leader than giving the truth
  - a. Building <u>themselves</u> up is more important than the goal of building <u>others</u> up in truth
  - b. Peter warned his readers, 'they will seek to make money from you' (II Pet 3:3)

Read Vs 8-11

- 1. Paul's clear to say problem isn't that these false teachers are wanting to use the OT law
  - a. Problem is they're misunderstanding & misapplying it
- 2. Law isn't for bring moral Christians a trip
  - a. It's to bring consciousness of our problem, leading us to desire a solution (Jesus)
  - b. It's not for any other contrary hidden message
  - c. Read Rom 3:19-20 stops at the problem
  - d. Gal 3:24-25 brought to the solution
- 3. So have high standards
  - a. We don't have high standards <u>to earn</u> God's favor, we have them b/c we <u>have</u> God's favor

b. Having standards doesn't make you a legalist, it shows you desire to be close to God's heart
4. This list is beliefs that are against God's heart
a. Murderers, sexually immoral to include homosexuals, human traffickers & liars
b. Each case is taking what doesn't belong to you
5. So the Law is the start, then we learn righteousness principles from Jesus

6. Vs 11 indicates Paul sees the Gospel as an enclosed item that he cannot change

# #2 – Be an example of the principles of grace (Vs12-17)

Read Vs 12-14

 We're ignorant & in darkness until the glorious light of God's grace comes flooding in

 Turn to Rom 10:1-4 – treat people gently
 Jesus: "Forgive, they know not what they do"

 What pulpit committee would've picked Paul?

 If God can greatly use Paul, He can use you
 God doesn't call the qualified (there are none), He qualifies the called

 a. God's not looking for our <u>abilities</u>, but our <u>availability</u> & faithfulness

Read Vs 15

- 1. "This is a faithful saying" intends to highlight
- 2. Jesus didn't come to condemn, came to save
  - a. For sinners that see their problem & need
- 3. Paul says he's the chief sinner
  - a. He's been Christian for 30 yrs at this point
  - b. Longer we live, the bigger the gap seems between us and our Lord Jesus
    - i. Not b/c our sin has changed but b/c we see it for what it is, in light of seeing Him

Read Vs 16

- 1. Sinners receive mercy and a new heart to bring glory to God
  - a. So we can be examples of the miraculous change God makes
  - b. So we can be examples of God's patience in waiting for us to repent

Read Vs 17

- 1. Paul's praise just bubbles up in joy here
  - a. The King: in charge and authority
  - b. Eternal: from forever past, to forever future
  - c. Immortal: of a higher structure than us
  - d. Invisible: Not completely knowable
  - e. Only Wise God: The only all-knowing one
- If we ever have trouble worshipping God, it's b/c we don't know who He really is!

## #3 – Have a plan to live out true faith & doctrine(Vs 18-20)

Read Vs 18-19a

- 1. War a good warfare, fight good fight of faith
  - a. "War" is Gk word *strategize* have a plan
    - i. What's your strategy to stay connected to God?
  - b. Chap 6 Paul says 'fight good fight of faith'
    - i. Put in the effort to stay in the true faith
  - c. 'Good warfare' means we can be fighting battles that don't matter

i. Many people fight against imperfection

- ii. Many people fight trivial non-sin issues
- iii. Let's fight THE battle to get the Gospel out
- 2. 'This command, I lay before you', will you pick it up?

Read Vs 19b-20

- 1. It's not just ok, but it's good to declare those that in the name of Jesus, live opposed to Jesus
  - a. Read Rom 16:17 Mark them so others don't stumble, as you would cordon off an explosive
  - b. So we name names not to shame them, but to protect others from there evil blasphemy
- 2. Why send them out of fellowship of church?
  - a. As in I Cor 5 so they'll see the destruction the flesh brings even quicker
- 3. So let's name a name: beware of *Joel Osteen* 
  - a. <u>Prosperity Gospel</u> Violated I Tim 6:6, etc
  - b. <u>Word-Faith Theology</u>, "We have to conceive it on the inside b4 we're ever going to receive it on the outside" – Violated Luke 14:33, etc
  - c. <u>What's Absent?</u> He rarely ever mentions sin, repentance & Jesus as only way to redemption

4. Hearing Osteen makes you think God's interest is to make <u>poor ones wealthy</u> & <u>sad ones happy</u>, but in reality, God wants to make <u>dead ones live</u>!

### Conclusion

So the lifestyle of the Church begins with its teaching and doctrine

- 1. Are we highly valuing God's Word over the counterfeits that come and go?
- 2. Is our life a living testimony of the principles of grace in God's Word?
