Romans 1 – 29 November 2020 "The Universal State Of Man"

Introduction

*Paul would have written this on 3rd Missionary trip between 54-58 AD

*He wants to tell this mostly Gentile church of our great salvation.

*Paul wants to come to them and then on to Spain.

*Romans provides us a systematic look at our great salvation in Jesus Christ

* Although we each have unique circumstances in life, we all have a universal problem.

*The good news is that our great God has Himself accomplished the universal solution for us all!

Today, we'll see 3 parts of the universal state of man: the solution, the cause & the consequences

But first, let see how Paul opens his letter to the believers at Rome w/ "Jesus in every verse" (vs 1-7) Read Vs 1-2

- 1. Vs 1 Paul's entire life is all centered on Jesus
 - a. He's a servant...of Jesus
 - b. He's called to be an apostle...of Jesus
 - c. He's set to the task of the gospel...of Jesus
- Vs 2 This gospel good news that has been promised to come is that of the coming of the Messiah...Jesus
- 3. Now, who is this Messiah named Jesus?

Read Vs 3-4

- Vs 3 He's God's Son who became human into the family of King David
- 2. Vs 4 He's more than the son of human flesh, He's the Son of God proved by the resurrection!
 Read Vs 5
 - 1. Jesus has given us all we need for this task.

Read Vs 6-7

- 1. So Paul is sure to tell them that they ALSO are called to be set apart to a special task for Jesus
- 2. Paul's blessing to them: Grace and Peace
 - a. Combining the Greek and Jewish blessings
 - b. Grace for blessings and free gifts
 - c. Peace for rest and satisfaction
- 3. So Paul's opening...it's all about Jesus
 - a. What Jesus is doing for Paul
 - b. And what Jesus is doing for them

1st we'll see the solution for this universal state, that is, faith in the powerful gospel (Vs 8-17)

Read Vs 8-9

- 1. We're all famous for something. These Christians were famous for their belief in Jesus
- 2. Paul was pleased to be praying for people that have such strong confidence in Christ's work.

Read Vs 10-13

- 1. Paul has been greatly desiring to come to them but has been held back so far, but why?
 - a. To share their mutual faith in words & actions
 - b. Paul wants to give to them & have them give to him mutual refreshment!
- 2. Notice there are many Gentiles in the church
 - a. This isn't just a Jewish thought and belief
 - b. How great is God that He has solved the universal problem of all mankind, regardless of your past, your culture or personal tendencies

Read Vs 14-15

- 1. It's w/ a grateful heart that Paul wants to 'preach the Gospel' to more Romans
- 2. "I have faith" isn't enough. Faith in what!?!

Read Vs 16-17

- 1. The power of the gospel is in believing it
- 2. As you believe the Gospel, you believe Jesus has cleansed & made you righteous before God

2nd we'll see the cause of this universal state, that is, nature has revealed God, but we've gone another way (Vs 18-23)

Read Vs 18-20

- Creation itself tells us that there's a Creator

 An eternal Creator (always has & will be)
 A divine Creator (not from within creation)

 It should be evident that anything we do

 against our eternal, divine Creator's will should
 gain His wrath against us
- 3. What is their crime? They hold(back) the trutha. They know the truth, but don't reveal it.

Read Vs 21-23

- 1. Attributing God's good deeds & attributes to something else is the heart of idolatry.
 - a. This devalues God / overvalues all else.
 - b. Nearly all sin starts with pride & idolatry
- 2. Pride: We get to see the rules
- 3. Idolatry: Giving to another what belongs to God

3rd we'll see the consequences of this universal state, that is, we pervert all that God has created (Vs 24-32)

Read Vs 24-25

- 1. "God gave them up" literally means to *allow them to betray* Him.
 - a. Same as God hardening Pharaoh's heart.
 - b. God speeds up what man is already set on
- 2. What were they "given up" to?
 - a. Lusts of their hearts
 - b. Allowed themselves to be devoted to things other than God
- 3. God allows them to betray Him in changing the physical <u>nature</u> (animals, statues, heavenly bodies) into something twisted and perverted
 - a. They worshipped creation rather than God
 - b. This overvalues the created item and twists its intended purpose.
- 4. Nature is intended to show God's glory (Psm 19)

Read Vs 26-27

- 1. God allows them to betray Him in changing the physical <u>body</u> into something twisted & perverted
 - a. Natural use of body wasn't good enough for them, so they twisted to homosexuality
- 2. What were they "given up" to?
 - a. Vile Affections = dishonorable feelings
 - b. Allowed their body to be run by feelings
- 3. Our bodies in marriage are intended to show the intimacy that God wants w/ each one of us

Read Vs 28-31

- 1. Vs 29 Maliciousness = a desire to injure
- 2. Vs 29 Debate = contention or strife
- 3. Vs 29 Malignity = bad character
- 4. Vs 31 w/o natural affection = w/o family love
- 5. Vs 31 Implacable = not at peace w/ anyone

- 6. God allows them to betray Him in changing their <u>mind</u> into something twisted & perverted
 - a. Reprobate mind = a disqualified mind
 - b. When people abandon the true knowledge of God, they reflect that the wrath of God is abiding upon them.
- 7. Our minds are intended to be the gatekeeper to our spirit
 - a. Whatever our mind believes controls the spirit
 - b. Whatever our mind believes controls the body.

Read Vs 32

- 1. No longer ashamed of sin but it's open
- 2. Notice the acknowledgement that those doing such sins, know they are worthy of death
 - a. The heart of man has a conscience that will admit it's sinful and needs judged.
 - i. The mind often gets in the way though.
 - ii. To avoid the mind, go for the conscience, ask,'have you always obeyed your conscience'?

Conclusion

1. There is a solution to the universal state of the human race

- a. It is faith in the Gospel of Jesus Christ
- b. It's not faith in....the abstract
- c. The Gospel do no good unless you put your trust into it...like you would trust a parachute

2. What has caused our universal state of sin?

- a. Creation itself tells us there's an eternal, heavenly Creator, yet we ignore that truth.
- b. In pride & idolatry, we create life the way we want it to be

3. There are consequences of living in this universal state of sin

- a. We pervert nature away from giving God glory to giving something else glory
- We pervert our bodies away from picturing the intimacy God what w/ each of us into unsatisfying lust
- c. We pervert our minds into a life of strife
