Job 35-37 –22 June 2023 "Pointing To God"

Introduction

*Book of Job opens w/ heavenly scene in which Satan asks permission to bring calamity into Job's life

*Chap 3-28 – saw Eliphaz, Bildad & Zophar give speeches (3, 3, 2) & Job responding to each

*Chap 29-31, Job took 3 chapters recounting the great scheme of his life...in a very selfish, godless way

*In Chap 32-37, the young man Elihu, who has been listening, steps up to respond to Job

*In this 2nd half of Elihu's speech to Job, he includes so profound statements regarding God's purposes

*Elihu here does a good job of directing Job off of himself and onto God Himself – thinking about God

Today we'll be persuaded about 3 intentions of God's mission as pertaining to mankind

1st: God's mission is unaffected by our sinful or godly actions (Job 35)

Read Chap 35:1-3

Elihu is misapplying what Job had earlier said
a. Job earlier said the wicked say these things
Elihu is saying Job is disinterested in what God

thinks whether we sin or not

a. As if Job said godliness doesn't avail at all Read Vs 4-8

- 1. Whether we sin or we're godly, it doesn't affect God Himself, but it affects us
- 2. Just like Jesus' trial before Pilate
 - a. It wasn't going to affect Jesus, but Pilate
 - b. Read Matt 27:22 "What shall <u>I</u> do..."

Read Vs 9-12

1. No one cries to God in the good times, only when they're being oppressed in the hard days

- 2. In vs 12 he claims that God won't <u>answer</u> b/c of the pride of Job
 - a. Wonder what he thinks when God begins to speak in chap 38?

Read Vs 13-16

- 1. God won't <u>hear</u> empty or vain words
- 2. God delight to include the humble in His plans, but He resists the proud

2nd: God's mission will open our ears to His greatness (Job 36)

Read Chap 36:1-4

- 1. Other friends appealed to man's wisdom, while Elihu appeals to God's wisdom
 - a. He has some good knowledge, but wisdom is properly applied knowledge
- 2. Elihu is speaking with a directness that the others didn't speak with

Read Vs 5-12

- 1. God rewards the obedient & disobedient perish
- 2. But God does also use suffering to open the ear to listen

Read Vs 13-15

- 1. The hypocrite is worse than the disobedient
- 2. Again, God opens ear by oppression

Read Vs 16-21

1. God wants to deliver you out of leanness and into fatness but instead you chose rebellion

Read Vs 22-25

1. God's greatness is seen by all and we must glorify Him for it

Read Vs 26-33

- 1. The unsearchable greatness of God
- 2. God's magnificent in the heavens and clouds
- 3. Apparently, a storm is brewing and Elihu uses
 - it as an illustration here of God's greatness

3rd: God's mission is beyond our full understanding (Job 37)

Read Chap 37:1-5

- 1. The thunder is as God's voice
- 2. God can do big things that are beyond our knowing

Read Vs 6-13

- 1. What the thunder of His voice can do
- 2. The greatness of God's creation
- 3. But also the submission of God's creation to Him

Read Vs 14-18

- 1. Job you don't know as much as you think you know
- 2. He thinks Job has been presumptuous & haughty

Read Vs 19-24

- 1. Stop trying to speak to God & simply fear Him
 - a. The answer is in the middle
 - b. Certainly, we should come to God in reverence, but God delights to hear from us

Conclusion

So, God is on a mission to glorify Himself, but also to redeem sinful man back to Himself

1. His mission is unaffected by our sinful or godly actions

a. He will not be persuaded off of this path!

2. His mission will open our ears to His Greatness

a. He's so loving that He will allow whatever it takes to show us our sin and to show us His majesty and worth!

3. His mission is beyond our full understanding

a. If our 3 lb brain could grasp all that God is doing and how it all fits together, He wouldn't be the mighty, awesome omnipotent God that He is
