I Samuel 8-10 -20 January 2022 "The Awkward Kingdom"

Introduction

- *I Samuel can be divided into 3 sections
 - *The instigation of earthly kingship (Chap 1-7)
 - *Focus on Samuel
 - *The failure of earthly kingship (Chap 8-15)
 - *Focus on King Saul
 - *God's man chosen & tried (Chap 16-31)
 - *Focus on David to be king
- *II Samuel depicts the entire reign of King David
- *Chap 4-7 was saw the capture of the ark, by the Philistines & God's power over it all
- *That's what leads them to beg for a king over them
- *Their eyes are on the enemy's power instead of God's
- *God's always wanted theocracy for them, not a kingdom
- *Today we see establishing of the awkward Kingdom
- *We do the same thing when we set our eyes of the enemy instead of God, we gin up ways to govt & regulate ourselves that were never God's intentions

*Today, the 5 principles of the awkward kingdom

1st principle is that it begins by replacing pursuit of God's Kingdom w/ an earthly kingdom (Chap 8:1-9) Read Chap 8:1-3

- 1. Every man needs to choose the Lord for himself, there's no second-hand salvation
- 2. Some leave the wise path b/c of the trials; some leave it b/c of the allure of good earthly things

Read Chap 8:4-6

- 1. Their desire? Godly king, not Samuel's sons
 - a. It's bad to have your eyes on how other nations do it
 - b. It's good to desire godly leaders, but not a king (Read Deut 17:14-20)
- 2. Very thing they want to avoid (leaders that just build their own kingdom) is what they're making

Read Chap 8:7

1. When you're serving the Lord, & people turn against you, they've really turned against God

- 2. They should exercise faith & serve God alone Read Chap 8:8-9
 - 1. They forsake God & turn to idols, now they forsake Samuel the Judge and turn to a king
 - 2. God will give them what they want, but this clearly isn't what is best for them
 - a. You can ask long enough that God give you 2nd best
 - b. Faith trusts God to provide, whereas fear takes matters into its own hands

2nd principle is that it's caused by not believing the Word of God (Chap 8:10-22)

Read Chap 8:10-13

- 1. Problems w/ having a king
- 2. He'll build a central govt by taking your people

Read Chap 8:14-17

- 1. He'll tax your livelihood
- 2. You'll lose personal liberties

Read Chap 8:18

- 1. God says thru Samuel, "You'll regret this"
- 2. The theme, 'He will take, he will take, he will take, and you will cry'
- 3. They've refused to believe the Word of God as spoke in Deut 17:14-20

Read 8:19-20

- 1. Their problems is that they simply refuse to believe the Word of God
 - a. From Deut 17:14-20
 - b. And thru Samuel right now! (See vs 10)
- 2. Root of our problems always come to a lack of believing God thru His Word

Read Chap 8:21-22

1. Same as when the Lord gave Balaam what he wanted, NOT B/C IT WAS WHAT WAS BEST

3rd principle is that God moves thru very natural ways for His will (Chap 9:1-27)

Read Vs 1-2

- 1. Kish was a man of great wealth & Saul was ruggedly good looking
- 2. What's missing from this whole introduction to Saul is any mention of God in Saul's life, just the physical

Read Chap 9:3-5

1. Took long time & they couldn't find the asses Read Chap 9:6-10

- 1. So they're gonna ask God thru a man where the asses are at & pay the Seer (Man of God –Samuel)
- 2. This isn't a bribe, just a polite gesture

Read Chap 9:11-14

- 1. So they come to Samuel at Zuph in Ephraim
- 2. This is where the custom of blessing God in prayer before eating comes from

Read Chap 9:15-17

- 1. God told Samuel to anoint Saul as King to reign over Israel & deliver them from Philistines
- 2. So God has orchestrated this meeting of these 2 Read Chap 9:18-20
 - 1. Saul immediately gets his asses answer AND told that he will be king...out of the blue!
 - a. You're desiring these asses, but all Israel is desiring is YOU
 - b. The lost asses were just God's way of bringing Saul to Smauel
 - 2. Has God ever used something that seemed annoying at the time, to accomplish His will for u?

Read Chap 9:21

- 1. Humble attitude about Kingship, but will it last Read Chap 9:22-24
- 1. Saul eats a king's meal with Samuel's guests

Read Chap 9:25-27

1. Samuel takes the time to talk with Saul

4th principle is that God is faithful to empower you for what He's called you to do (Chap 10:1-16)

Read Chap 10:1

- 1. Anointing was a pic of the H.S. coming upon someone to do the Lord's work
- 2. Just as water baptism is a picture of the baptism of the H.S., this anointing of oil is just a picture of the real anointing of God in Saul's life

Read Chap 10:2-5

- 1. 3 signs <u>confirming</u> Samuel prophecy concerning Saul becoming King
 - a. You'll find men that say the asses are found
 - b. You'll see 3 men going to worship God that will give you bread
 - c. You'll meet singing school of the prophets
- 2. These were to encourage Saul to believe

Read Chap 10:6

1. Saul will be convinced that the Lord is working in his life – change always happens upon belief!

Read Chap 10:7-8

- 1. When God is working in your life, press in
- 2. But there was a specific instruction here in vs 8 to wait for Samuel

Read Chap 10:9-10

- 1. As Saul went, the 3 signs DID happen
- 2. Remember, as Israel called for a kingdom, Saul hasn't done anything wrong here
- 3. Saul has found himself identifying with the spiritual men...for maybe the first time

Read Chap 10:11-13

- 1. Prophets were made fun of for their eccentric behavior & they were learned in the scriptures
- 2. Saul had been very different from them
- 3. Saul being w/ them stood out as change

Read Chap 10:14-16

- 1. Samuel told Eli the WHOLE matter b/c Eli asked him to and it was about Eli
- 2. Here Saul tells his uncle only part of this matter...out of humility

5th principle is that it's culminated with a variety of responses (Chap 10:17-27)

Read Chap 10:17-19

- 1. Mixed bag Come meet your king (yay), but it's b/c you rejected your God (ouch!)
- 2. God has proved that He alone can save yet
 - a. Fear would have them need an earthly king
 - b. Laziness would have them want a king

Read Chap 10:20-21

- 1. He didn't show up for his coronation
- 2. Why? Lazy? Feared men? Feared the job?
- 3. This is his 1st sign of spiritual weakness
 - a. Earlier when he said, 'I'm nothing', that was before he knew he was called of God
 - b. Now God has called, he can't hold back

Read Chap 10:22-24

- 1. W/ Samuel's credibility, Saul is on board
- 2. Notice, Samuel is still looking on the outward

Read Chap 10:25

- 1. From Chap 8:11-18 He will take-you will cry
- 2. Their flesh is happy, but Sam brings sobriety

Read Chap 10:26-27

- 1. God is doing a work in Saul's life
- 2. When God intervenes, there's division (Matt 10:34)
 - a. Vs 27 Those of the flesh will stir immediate conflict
 - b. But the joy of Vs 26 to walk thru life w/ like-minded people!

Conclusion

So, this is a great picture of what it's like when we forsake living for God's Kingdom & go about establishing our own kingdom on earth

- 1. It's caused by not believing God's Word
- 2. God moves even natural circumstances to accomplish His will, even if it means we get 2nd best
- 3. Yet God is faithful to empower those that will do His will
- 4. It culminates in a variety of responses
 - a. Unbelievers will hate the work for God
 - b. Godly will be used of God to accomplish great things
