II Chronicles 24-25 – 18 December 2025 "He Did What Was Right A.N.D...."

Introduction

- *Today we see 2 of the ficklest kings Judah ever has
- *Websters 1828 Dictionary for fickle
- *Wavering; inconstant; unstable; of a changeable mind; irresolute; not firm in opinion or purpose; capricious. Not fixed or firm; liable to change
- *Today we'll see the 8th (Joash) & 9th (Amaziah) kings of Judah
- *We look today at what holds fickle people in a stable state, as short-lived as it is, and what turns them
- *It is said of both kings, that they did that which was right in the sight of Yahweh AND something else
 - *The AND is so dangerous
 - *The AND is Adultery, Narcissism & Defeat

Today, we'll see the godly virtue AND more for these two kings of Judah

#1 – Joash: It's Right To Follow Godly People (Chap 24:1-16)

Read Vs 24:1-3

- 1. This is the latest & last example of polygamy in the entire Bible
 - a. They didn't see it as lust for sex & pride, but as a means of growth & legacy-still wrong
 - b. As Abe & Hagar "helped God out" in doing God's will, so too Jehoiada does the same
 - c. Right motive, wrong means sinful
- 2. Joash's is only prompted in his heart to serve the Lord b/c of those around him

Read Vs 4-7

- 1. What a wonderful thing that Joash is allowing his heart to be stirred by the Lord & not the world
 - a. He found something in the Bible that wasn't being done and took up the cause
 - b. Would to God that we each would do this
- 2. Plan was to have priests go collect the money annually & bring it to Jerusalem
- 3. Problem is that it was very slow

Read Vs 8-14

- 1. II King12:6 tells us this change was in Joash's 23rd year as king (30 years old)
- 2. There were 3 changes made
 - a. Vs 10 People brought their money directly– cut out middle management
 - b. Vs 11 Multiple people empty the box daily for great accountability and no theft
 - c. Vs 12 Money given directly to those doing the work again removing a layer of admin
- 3. There are very tangible things that can be done to keep the process of serving God very simple

Read Vs 15-16

- 1. The selfless one, the caretaker ruler when Joash was so young, is honored as a king
- 2. The blessing of long life comes to the obedient
- 3. Our Lord Jesus said, those that humble themselves will be exalted
- 4. The ultimate power couple in the Bible Jehoiada and his wife Jehoshabeath

#2 – Joash: His Adultery, Narcissism & Defeat (Chap 24:17-27)

Read Vs 24:17-19

- 1. "And the king listened to them"
 - a. Only do this if that voice aligns w/ the Lord
 - b. Shows the shallowness of someone's faith that if 1 pillar of strength is removed it falls
- 2. This would be a great time to read Book of Joel
 - a. He prophesied during this time
- b. He said, God is coming, repent & get ready

Read Vs 20-22

- 1. No doubt that Zechariah & his father Jehoiada both stepped into trouble "by the Spirit of God"
 - a. Jehoiada's actions won the day & he lived
 - b. Zechariah's didn't win the day & he died
 - c. BOTH were the right actions let God choose the results ours is to faithfully serve
- 2. Same as giving out the Gospel ours is the actions of giving it God's is the results

Read Vs 23-24

- 1. Where there is disobedience, God removes His blessing & even a small band can defeat us
- 2. II Kings 12:18 says, Joash took the treasures dedicated to God to bribe Hazael to leave them
 - a. This is a real mark of unfaithfulness trusting resources instead of turning to God
 - b. Willing to take back what they gave to God

Read Vs 25-27

- 1. It's sinful to have killed the King like this
- 2. But in this world, you'll reap what you sow

#3 – Amaziah: It's Right To Follow God's Law (Chap 25:1-13)

Read Vs 25:1-2

- 1. None can be perfect, so "doing good" indicates the general direction of the steps of the heart
- 2. Yet he allowed something else to hold a piece of his heart (the A.N.D.)

Read Vs 3-4

- 1. Though Joash forsook the Lord in his later years, Amaziah immediately began w/ godliness
 - a. It was godly justice to kill those murderers
 - b. Yet he didn't seek vengeance in anger
- 2. "Eye for an eye" is justice without vengeance

Read Vs 5-8

- 1. If enter an agreement & later realize there's sin involved we must remove from the agreement
- 2. We'll develop many excuses why we can't
 - a. I'll lose money, or reputation or friends
 - . But this shows we're not pondering what *God can do* for a faithful, clean servant!
- 3. Decisions can make all the earthly sense in the world, but if they don't make spiritual sense, God is against it

Read Vs 9

1. Do you believe that the value of God's favor is far greater than the value of any action we can take

- a. Example after example is given in II Chr
- b. Jericho fell to a band of singers & worshippers
- c. Gideon's 300 defeats the multitude of Midian
- 2. Greatest resource we could have is a faithful life Read Vs 10-13
 - 1. Amaziah's warfare is victorious b/c he obeyed God but the consequences of his previous disobedient agreement w/ Israel weren't finished
 - 2. Israel's violent assault against Judah proved why Amaziah shouldn't have trusted them

#4 – Amaziah: His Adultery, Narcissism & Defeat (Chap 25:14-28)

Read Vs 25:14-16

- 1. In moments of success, pride can easily take us into lusting after the next shiny thing
 - a. Not logical to lust after these defeated gods
 - b. We see the destruction our lust has caused others & yet we go into them ourselves, dumb!

2. God graciously sent Amazaih a correcting prophet, but he rejected God thru him

Read Vs 17-20

- 1. A little by of success makes us lustful and blind to our utter dependence on God for victory
- 2. Reminds us of Samson
 - a. Could defeat great foes but forgot his very strength came from God & not from within

Read Vs 21-24

- 1. Results of meddling b/c of pride
 - a. Defenses broken down, Treasures stolen
 - b. Humbled in the heart of his power
- 2. Pride and arrogance are blinding

Read Vs 25-28

- 1. When in a position of influence, you'll always have people that love you & hate you
- 2. Only thing we can do to be ready against attack in these times is to be trusting the Lord

Conclusion

So, have you been analyzing your own fickleness?

- 1. Joash began serving the Lord as he was motivated by the Godly people around him
 - a. But when they left everything changed
- 2. Joash fell into the A.N.D.
 - a. Adultery against God, led to narcissism, which led to defeat
 - b. He forgot the great value of having God's blessing from walking in obedience
- 3. Amaziah began serving the Lord and following God's Law
 - a. But when he was lifted up in victory & pride everything changed
- 4. Amaziah fell into the A.N.D.
 - a. Adultery against God, led to narcissism, which led to defeat
 - b. He also forgot the great value of having God's blessing from walking in obedience

Let us always remember the great value of walking w/God and letting Him use us for His glory & our good!
