II Samuel 19-20 –26 May 2022 "Second Chances"

Introduction

*II Samuel – depicts the entire reign of King David

*Chap 11-12 we saw David's great sin & cover-up

*Chap 13-18 we saw story of Absalom, but it's really story of David's sins of omission & his loyal friends

*Now Absalom's rebellion is ended & David has returned to Jerusalem

*This is a time of second chances for everyone

*All chose sides, they showed their loyalty...or not

*Many people that acted for or against David while he had no power on the run, now have to react to David being back in power

*David also, how will he act with another chance at ruling the nation & pointing all to Christ Jesus?

*Today, here's 7 questions to ask yourself regarding, how do you handle second changes

1st question: Do you see the chance to correct relationships? (Chap 19:1-7)

Read Chap 19:1-4

- 1. If you're focused on the wrong thing, you can miss the chance for reconciliation
- 2. When sin is torn from our life it can hurt, but we need to turn our eyes onto pure godly things

Read Vs 5-7

- 1. Joab's advice to mourning David is to consider the living not the dead
 - a. Consider the lives spared, don't consider the sinful path that was put to death
 - b. Connect your heart to the godly, not to the sinners
- 2. David has a wonderful chance here to rekindle godly relationships with the people of the land, but he has to get beyond his loss to do it

2nd question: Do you see the chance at peace? (Chap 19:8-15)

- Read Chap 19:8-10
 - 1. The people were confused & nervous as to how David would now treat them
 - 2. Prime time for David to build bridges of peace

Read Vs 11-15

- 1. Judah is hesitant to recognize David as king until David decided to make Amasa general in place of Joab
- 2. Call it an olive branch but peace doesn't just happen someone has to initiate it

3rd question: Do you see the chance to be gracious? (Chap 19:16-23)

Read Chap 19:16-20

- 1. Shimei doesn't waste his 2nd chance
- 2. He wants to repent & ask for forgiveness
- 3. He apologizes for cursing David as he left the throne

Read Vs 21-23

- In spite of Abishai, David shows grace to Shimei
- 2. Justice can be had everywhere, but grace has the opportunity to change a heart & a life

4th question: Do you see the chance to show love? (Chap 19:24-30)

Read Chap 19:24

- 1. Let you light so shine before men that they see your good works & glorify your Father
- 2. Mephibosheth looked like a mourner "we are living epistles known & read of all men
- 3. Mephibosheth's dedication to David is evident

Read Vs 25-28

- 1. Mephibosheth explains why he didn't physically follow after David, but IS loyal
- 2. M knows he's already got more than deserved Read Vs 29-30
 - 1. M isn't concerned with the "stuff" but just with having his lord the king back
 - 2. M could be mad b/c he stuff is being taken, but his love of the king is greater than his love of stuff
 - 3. Solomon learned "cut the baby in 1/2" here

5th question: Do you see the chance to bless others? (Chap 19:31-39)

Read Chap 19:31-32

- 1. Barzillai helped David at a time he needed it
- Now upon the 2nd chance meeting, David wants to show his thanks
- He blessed David earlier b/c it was right, NOT
 b/c it helped him in any way

Read Vs 33-35

- 1. Barzillai is very self-aware, humble
- 2. Would be waste to put physical blessings in him

Read Vs 36-39

- David seeks to bless Barzillai for his help, but he refuses politely only asking that his servant Chimham is blessed instead
- 2. How many of us upon getting a 2nd chance would use it to bless others & not self?

6th question: Do you see vulnerability for selfish gain? (Chap 19:40-20:3)

Read Chap 19:40-43

- The dispute of who 1st asked David to come back (Judah or Israel) leads to Sheba's rebellion
- 2. Many of these same men had no problem deserting David for Absalom
- 3. So there's still weakness here in Israel
 - a. How do you handle 2nd chances in which you have the power to manipulate things?

Read Chap 20:1-2

- 1. This was a great chance to ask, "What's God's will for me? Whom does God want as my king?"
- 2. Our will is irrelevant, to God's declared will
- 3. Use our 2nd chances for godliness, not selfishness

Read Chap 20:3

1. Caring for these women the concubines

7th question: Do you see a chance at selfrighteousness? (Chap 20:4-26)

Read Chap 20:4-10

- 1. Amasa squanders his 2nd chance w/ laziness
- 2. Amasa's sloppy delay gave Joab the chance to take back his position as general

Read Vs 11-13

- 1. They move and cover dying Amasa to not distract the soldiers from marching to Sheba
- 2. Joab's using his 2nd chance to do king's will

Read Vs 14-22

- 1. Joab's army was besieging the city ready to destroy it if needed to get Sheba
- 2. This wise woman knew how to prevent war and civil war at that
- 3. Deut 20:10: you should offer city terms of peace
- 4. Joab's sloppy attack is corrected by a women

Read Vs 23-26 – Historical Note

Conclusion

Changes come in the blink of an eye, sometimes raising you into power & control, sometimes bringing you out of power & control & under the mercy of others. Question is: how do you use your 2nd chances

- **1.** Do you see the chance to correct relationships?
- 2. Do you see the chance at peace?
 - a. Every 2nd chance is a chance to improve the lives of others....and yourself
- **3.** Do you see the chance to be gracious?
- 4. Do you see the chance to show love?
 - a. Grace & love now can cover hurts from the past
- 5. Do you see the chance to bless others?
- 6. Do you see vulnerability & seek your own gain?
- 7. Do you see a chance at self-righteousness?
 - a. Jut about the moment we try taking advantage of a situation, we can be sure someone will be trying that back on us

The best chance at a 2nd chance is to offer selfless love
