Luke 6:1-16 – 5 March 2023 "There's Something Bigger"

Introduction

- *Since Chap 4 Jesus has been teaching of His identity & His mission to bring the Kingdom of God to people
- *He's calling people to trust & follow Him as Lord
- *He's been attracting many skeptics
- *Skeptics are often skeptics b/c they're focused on the wrong things
 - *Or b/c they're seeing right things in wrong way
- *Believers & non-believers both look at God's principles; 1 sees an interrogator's light & 1 sees a guiding light
- *Question is will we seek to see things from God's eternal point of view or only from man's temporary "personal happiness" point of view

Today, we'll see 3 ways Jesus refocuses us on the bigger purposes of our Christian life

1st way Jesus refocuses us is re: His principles: Bigger than prevention is the provision (Vs 1-5)

Read Vs 1

- 1. 2nd sabbath after the first? Means 2nd Sabbath after the Passover
- 2. This wasn't stealing, Read Deut 23:25

- 1. There comes a time in your witnessing that detractors begin watching you
- 2. Notice they assumed their laws into God's principles when they weren't there
- 3. Sabbath speaks of rest in creation that God wants to give to us (Read Heb 4:8-9)
 - a. Read Col 2:16-17 Sabbath was pointing to Christ's rest
 - b. This account happened at time Jesus said (Read) Matt 11:28-30 I'll give you rest

Read Vs 3-4

- 1. Jesus inserts (Read) Matt 12:7 mercy not...
- 2. Sustaining life and provision for life is even of higher value than not working
- 3. God is more interested in us experiencing His mercy *for us* that our giving *to Him*
 - a. The sabbath is a provision for us not a prevention
 - b. When we require physical provision to live, God wants us to have it
- 4. Jesus also inserted (Read) Mark 2:27
 - a. Sabbath designed to help us, not harm us
- 5. In Matt 12:5-6 Jesus gives a 2nd example in which priests work on sabbath & it's no problem

- 1. Jesus says He has the right to declare what is acceptable on the Sabbath Day
 - a. Sabbath was a sign between God & Israel (Exo 31:13), but it began at Creation
 - b. Jesus is claiming authority of the Creator

2nd way Jesus refocuses us is re: His goals: Bigger than principles is the people (Vs 6-11)

Read Vs 6

- 1. He taught...b/c THAT was His mission
- 2. Only Dr. Luke says which hand it was

- 1. Matthew says they spoke up & asked Jesus if it's lawful to heal on the sabbath days
- 2. They had no interest in the cripple man or compassion, they only wished to condemn Jesus
- 3. Matthew records (Read Matt 12:11-12) that Jesus asked them
 - a. Lawful to pull your own sheep back to life?
 - b. Value of man is much greater, so we do it
- 4. Two lessons here
 - a. Sabbath law isn't to prevent us from having compassion on each other but to provide it
 - b. If we would see people as ones God has put around us for us to help (they're my sheep), then maybe we'd provide more compassion

Read Vs 8-9

- 1. Of course, the answer is that we should always do good
 - a. In Matthew 22:36-40 Pharisees asked what's the great commandment love

Read Vs 10

- 1. Mark 3:5 says Jesus looked on them w/ anger for the hardness of their hearts
- 2. Jesus is looking for mercy, tenderness & help
 - a. He resists proud & give grace to the humble
- 3. Notice Jesus gave what looked like an impossible command, but the man obey in faith
 - a. Jesus does so for us; "Be anxious for nothing", "love your enemies", "Avoid fornication"

- 1. 'Madness' is *anoia* or a rage-filled stupidity
 - a. Word only used once other (II Tim 3:8-9) as folly
 - b. You have to willingly resist the truth to ether this

3rd way Jesus refocuses us is re: His methods: Bigger than the men is the mission (Vs 12-16)

Read Vs 12

1. Master, mission, mates – choosing who we invest our lives into is a matter of deep prayer

Read Vs 13

- 1. There're many following & learning from Him
- 2. These 12 were taken to receive power to be representations of Jesus with His original message
- 3. What's qualification of an apostle?
 - a. Have seen the resurrection (Act 1:22)
 - b. Work miracles (II Cor 12:12)
 - c. Chosen of Jesus Himself (Luke 6:13, Act 9:15)

- 1. <u>Simon</u> son of Jonah, Peter the fisherman w/ the foot-shaped mouth
- 2. <u>Andrew</u> the fisherman, Peter's brother, the apostle of little things
- 3. <u>James & John</u> sons of Zebedee fisherman whom Jesus names Boanerges (sons of thunder)

- a. John the beloved would write 5 NT books
- 4. Philip always listed as the 5th apostle
- 5. <u>Nathaniel</u>, Bartholomew (means son of Talmai)

Read Vs 15

- 1. <u>Matthew</u> Levi the tax collector son of Alphaeus
- 2. Thomas the doubter
- 3. <u>James</u> the less the son of Alphaeus
- 4. <u>Simon</u> the zealot the Canaanite

- 1. <u>Judas</u> the brother of James not Iscariot known as Lebbaeus Thaddaeus
- 2. <u>Judas</u> Iscariot the traitor
 - a. With the best circumstances and best teacher, he still went off the rails
- 3. All men from different backgrounds that are not, of themselves influential
 - a. Read I Cor 1:26-27 & 2:5 God gets glory
 - b. Only 2 years from now til cross they're about to undertake a radical transformation
 - c. We too can change world in next 2 years

Conclusion

So let be careful we don't focus on the wrong things Major in the major things; & minor in the minor things Are we focused in the bigger things that Jesus was focused on?

- 1. Regarding His principles; God's Word isn't <u>preventions</u> but bigger than that, it's <u>provision</u>
 - a. God has provided all the wisdom we need for life and godliness He's helping us
- 2. Regarding His goals; We're not just here to serve the <u>principles</u>, but bigger than that, we're here to serve the <u>people</u>
 - a. We're not tallying up how many rules we've keep, but how many people we've presented Jesus to
- 3. Regarding His methods; We don't just boast about men, but bigger than that, we boast about the mission
 - a. God wants to use the humblest of tools to perform the work of reaching souls for Jesus
