I Chronicles 1-9 –4 September 2025 "Outlining Our Obligatory Orientation"

Introduction

- *The Chronicles was written in the days of Ezra, probably by Ezra
- *This is in the days after the Babylonian Captivity upon Israel's return to the land
- *Israel is being reconstituted & considering what the Lord wants from them
- *1st 9 chapters of Chronicles are genealogies recorded for the Jews that are reconstituting in the land
- *Remember that there are sections of the Bible we need to emphasize WHY it's here more so that simply knowing the words on the page this is one of them

Today, we'll outline this entire section with the goal of organizing ourselves w/ the same mindset At the end we'll make further applications for us

1st – From Adam to Israel (Chap 1)

Chap 1:1-3

1. 9 Generations from Adam to Noah's dad Lamech

Chap 1:4

- 1. Noah & his 3 sons
- 2. Now we branch into each of these 3 sons

Chap 1:5-7

- 1. 1st of Noah's sons Japheth & his family
- 2. Many of these sons became powerful nations
 - a. Named after themselves
 - b. Migrated toward the northwest of Israel

Chap 1:8-16

- 1. 2nd of Noah's sons Ham & his family
- 2. Migrated in Israel & toward southwest of Israel

Chap 1:17-19

- 1. 3rd of Noah's sons Shem & his family
- 2. 5 generations: Shem to Eber's sons Peleg & Joktan
 - a. Read Chap 1:19 Tower of Babel occurred at this time
 - b. Notice Noah was still alive at this time

Chap 1:20-23

1. 1st of Eber's sons Joktan

Chap 1:24-27

- 1. 2nd of Eber's sons Peleg
- 2. Brings us down 5 more generations to Abram

Chap 1:28

- 1. Abraham & his 2 sons
- 2. Rest of his sons thru wife Keturah are later

Chap 1:29-31

1. 1st of Abe's sons Ishmael & his family

Chap 1:32-33

1. Abe's family thru Keturah

Chap 1:34

- 1. Abe to Isaac & his 2 sons Esau & Israel
- 2. Now we branch into each of these 2 sons

Chap 1:35-54

- 1. 1st of Isaac's sons Esau & his family
- 2. These were the Edomites in Mt Seir

From Israel thru Judah to David (Chapter 2)

Chap 2:1-2

- 1. Jacob, renamed Israel, & his 12 sons
- 2. We'll go into each of these 12 sons in chap 4-7
 - a. Including Dan which is more obscure
 - b. Intention of chap 2 is for Judah to David

Chap 2:3-4

- 1. Judah & his 5 sons
- 2. Read Vs 3 These accounts are in Gen 38
- 3. We'll trace 2 of Judah's sons Perez & Zerah

Chap 2:5

- 1. 1st of Judah's sons Perez & his 2 sons
- 2. We'll only trace down his son Hezron

Chap 2:6-8

- 1. Now 2nd of Judah's sons Zerah
- 2. This includes vs 7 the account of Achan (Achar) sin at Jericho in the days of Joshua (Jos 7)

Chap 2:9

- 1. Perez son Hezron & his 3 sons
- Rest of this chapter traces these 3 sons Ram,
 Caleb & Jarahmeel

Chap 2:10-17

- 1. 1st of Hezron's sons Ram & his family
- 2. Intention here is to trace down to King David

Chap 2:18-24

- 1. 2nd of Hezron's sons Caleb & his family
- 2. Come back to Caleb & his descendants in vs 42

Chap 2:25-41

- 1. 3rd of Hezron's sons Jarahmeel & his family
- 2. Now vs 31 seems to be a daughter of Sheshan named Ahlai b/c in vs 34 it says how his daughter married to continue his lineage

Chap 2:42-50a

1. We continue the 2nd of Hezron's sons Caleb & his family including son Hur

Chap 2:50b-55

1. We have Hur's family leading to the family of the Rechabites

From David thru his kingly lineage (Chapter 3)

Chap 3:1-9

- 1. David & his 19 sons plus sons by concubines
- 2. This includes Nathan whom Mary came thru
- 3. We'll track David's son Solomon's Kingship

Chap 3:10-14

1. Solomon's 16 generations down to Josiah

Chap 3:15-18

- 1. Josiah's 4 sons but we trace thru son Jehioakim to his son Jeconiah
- 2. This is at the time of Babylonian Captivity

Chap 3:19-24

- 1. Now Jeconiah's son Pedaiah & his family
- 2. Beginning w/ Pedaiah's son Zerubbabel, these are those that came back from Babylon to rebuild

Family of the Tribe of Judah (Chapter 4:1-23)

- 1. In vs 9-10 we have the man Jabez
 - a. He wasn't honorable b/c of royal birth or power
 - b. He was honorable above others b/c he called on God
 - c. He brought his life to God & asked for more
 - d. God can enlarge the influence of a person that asks the Lord to do great things

Family of the Tribe of Simeon (Chapter 4:24-43

- 1. Their people are in vs 24-27
- 2. Their places are in vs 28-39
- 3. Their pastures are in vs 40-43
- 4. They're praised in vss 40-42 for taking out former Canaanites & possessing the land as God told them

Family of the Tribe of Reuben (Chapter 5:1-10)

- 1. Read Vs 1-2 We're reminded how Reuben lost the birthright & blessing
 - a. Gen 35:22 says he committed adultery w/Bilhah his brother Dan & Naphtali's mom
 - b. This is an attempt to usurp Israel's authority& take over the family
- 2. Read Vs 9-10 The Reubenites expanded eastward in the days of Saul controlling the land of the Hagrites

Family of the Tribe of Gad (Chapter 5:11-22)

- 1. Read Vs 18-22 Reuben, Gad & ½ of Manasseh beat back the Hagrites b/c they trusted God
- 2. Recorded here for all time b/c of their faith
- 3. Israel expanded b/c a few people trusted in the Lord

Family of the ½ Tribe of Manasseh (Chapter 5:23-26)

- 1. Read Vs 25-26 Though they experienced a great walk of faith, later they engaged in spiritual adultery against the God who helped them
- 2. Therefore they fell into captivity much earlier than the other tribes of Israel

Family of the Tribe of Levi (Chapter 6)

Chap 6:1

1. Levi & his 3 sons

Chap 6:2-15

- 1. 1st of Levi's sons Kohath & his family
- 2. This includes the priests starting w/ Aaron

Chap 6:16-28

1. 2nd of Levi's sons Gershom & his family

Chap 6:29-30

1. 3rd of Levi's sons Merari & his family

Read Chap 6:31-32 – Introduces the singers

- 1. Chap 6:33-38 The singers of Kohath
- 2. Chap 6:39-43 The singers of Gershom
- 3. Chap 6:44-48 The singers of Merari

Chap 6:49-53

1. Detailing what Aaron & priest's role was

Chap 6:54-81

1. Lists the 48 cities given to the Levis around the country and the 6 Cities of Refuge (manslaughter)

Tribes of Issachar, Benjamin, Dan, Naphtali, Manasseh, Ephraim, & Asher (Chapter 7)

Chap 7:1-5 - Family of Issachar

Chap 7:6-11 - Family of Benjamin

Chap 7:12

- 1. Family of Dan
- 2. Aher seems to be a slur for the Tribe of Dan
 - a. Aher means another or the one following

- b. Hushim is listed as Dan's son in Gen 46:23
- 3. Dan was the most idolatrous and moved out of their possession of land
 - a. May have been spurning Dan for these reasons

Chap 7:13 - Family of Naphtali

Chap 7:14-19 - Family of Manasseh

Chap 7:20-29 - Family of Ephraim

Chap 7:30-40 - Family of Asher

Tribe of Benjamin (again) for the purpose of getting to King Saul (Chapter 8)

- 1. While chap 7:6-12 seems to emphasize Benjamin's mighty men and leaders, chap 8 gives a full genealogy as an official record for King Saul
- 2. 8:1-32 lists from Benjamin to Saul's father Kish
- 3. 8:33-40 lists Saul family specifically

Israelites Returning From Exile (Chapter 9)

Chap 9:1-9

1. Leaders in Jerusalem

Chap 9:10-13

1. Leaders among the priests returning

Chap 9:14-16

1. Leaders among the Levites returning

Chap 9:17-27

1. Leaders among the gatekeepers returning

Chap 9:28-34

- 1. Leaders among the other temple servants
- 2. There was great organization to God's service

Chap 9:35-44

- 1. Repeat of chap 8:29-38 for emphasis on the king
- 2. We'll begin with this moment in history as we begin chapter 10

Conclusion

Chronicles will recount Israel's history during their united and then divided kingdom

But 1st, we have this outline & overview to handle We've outlined the history & reestablishment of the nation of Israel at the occasion of their regathering

Let these things get you organized in our understanding of Israel thru the whole Bible

Today we've seen 3 types of people and structures

And consider how this structure applies to our life as well

- 1. Re-establishing the National Identity w/ Kings & Political Leaders (Administrative)
 - a. Have we placed a godly structure over governing our lives?
 - b. We're each in charge of governing something within our lives, make it godly

2. Restoring the Religious Leadership Structure (Spiritual)

- a. Have we placed a religious structure to our lives in a regular routine?
- b. What is our commitment to habits of Bible study, prayer, fellowship and service the Lord?

3. Reminding of God's faithfulness to those who are faithful to Him (Practical)

- a. Are we focused on using our experiences to walk in faith glorifying God with our belief?
- b. Regardless of the situation in your country, your family, or your job/school, the Lord blesses those the are faithful to Him in spite of our circumstances
