## II Kings 24-25 – 8 December 2022 "There Is A Limit"

## **Introduction**

- \*God has been warning His people Israel to repent of their idolatry & pride for 400 yrs since time of David
- \*From 640 BC until now (605 BC) Judah had a great chance at restoration / renewal under good king Josiah
- \*As the whole book of Jeremiah shows, the nation still clings to their own ways and their own will
- \*Tonight, Israel as a nation comes to an end
- \*There is a limit...
  - \*There's a limit to corruption & sin God allows
- \*There's a limit to how much evil God will allow to affect the innocent children
  - \*There's a limit before judgement falls
- \*So, here are 3 things we can do if we find that we've been allowing sin to persist in our life

# 1<sup>st</sup> thing we should be when we see persist sin: Determine whom we really serve (Chap 24:1-17)

Read Vs 1-7 - Reign of Jehoiakim

- 1. Jehoiakim can't figure out whether to serve Egypt or Babylon (b/c he should be serving God)
  - a. Read Jer 22:17 He couldn't figure whom to align with b/c he was really serving self
  - b. "Oh God, should I eat McDs or B King? Neither...you should be eating Chic-fil-a" haha
- 2. During the reign of Manasseh, God determined to exile Judah to Babylon (Read Jer 25:9)
- 3. Although this was generally long foretold in the Law of Moses (Lev 26:33-35), it's now occurring in 605 BC w/ Babylon
  - a. This is the 1<sup>st</sup> of 3 waves of deportations
  - b. Daniel & many others taken to Babylon
- 4. It's b/c of their idolatry but it's length of time is b/c of not recognizing land sabbaths prescribed in (Read) Lev 25:2-7 (II Chr 36:21 / Jer 25:11-12)
  - a. Ezra 3:8 gives exact date they come back & end the 70 years of punishment in 535 BC

## Read Vs 8-9 - Reign of Jehoiachin

1. Jehoiachin is on throne only 3 months when Babylon comes back for 2<sup>nd</sup> attack in 597 BC

#### Read Vs 10-16

1. Being besieged, Jehoiachin surrenders and many are deported & a great spoil is taken

#### Read Vs 17

- 1. Mattaniah, renamed Zedekiah is NOT son of Jehoiachin, but his uncle, Josiah's 3<sup>rd</sup> son to reign
  - a. Jeremiah had prophesied this (Read Jer 22:28-30)
  - b. Spiritual implications in that Messiah doesn't come thru the lineage of Jehoiachin

# 2<sup>nd</sup> thing we should be when we see persist sin: Use hard times to repent & soften (Chap 24:18-25:21)

Read Vs 18-20 - Reign of Zedekiah

- 1. II Chr 26:12 says he didn't humble himself before Jeremiah who was sent from the Lord
- 2. Hard times from God will either...
  - a. Hasten your repentance & softening or hasten your hardening against God
  - b. Same sun that softens wax, will harden clay
  - c. Like hardening of Pharoah's heart (Moses)
- 3. Their hearts were far from God's will, but they convinced themselves that God was on their side
- 4. Not only was Jeremiah telling them to submit to Babylon, but also God would bring them back!
  - a. Jer 31:23 Restoration of Hebrew language
  - b. Jer 31:31-33 Would be a New Covenant

#### Read Vs 1-6

1. This is the final siege & conquest of Jerusalem & of Israel occurring in 586 BC

#### Read Vs 7

1. Interesting prophecies that Zedekiah would see & speak w/ Nebo (Read Jer 32:4) but wouldn't see Babylon (Read Eze 12:13)

#### Read Vs 8-10

1. Temple is sacked to the ground & main defense of city (what makes it a city) the wall is broken

#### Read Vs 11-17

1. All the treasures & blessings from God are now spoiled and taken from them

#### Read Vs 18-21

- 1. These were strong men that would have revolted against Babylon
- 2. Harsh to kill them? Read II Chr 36:14-16
  - a. They constantly rejected the Lord
  - b. These horrid events are what Jeremiah wrote Lamentations about
  - c. Jeremiah was called a traitor, yet he always told them hard truth they didn't want to hear

# 3<sup>rd</sup> thing we should be when we see persist sin: Accept this world won't give proper results (Chap 25:22-30)

#### Read Vs 22-24

- 1. Gedaliah was actually being obedience to what God told them in submitting to Babylon (Jer 27)
- 2. Jew actually started to return a bit out of their hiding places in the surrounding countries
  - a. Things seemed a bit stable

#### Read Vs 25-26

- 1. Now everyone is scared and fleeing again b/c of their disobedience to the Lord
- 2. Gedaliah was seeking God but associating with bad men

#### Read Vs 27-30

- 1. Daniel & Jehoiachin were both promoted in Babylon, but it matters how you get there
- 2. Jehoiachin's earthly prosperity meant nothing b/c of his spiritual poverty

# Conclusion

Have you found yourselves in a place where there is sin all around & you know you've been a part of it?

## 1. Determine whom we really serve

- a. Bible says to examine yourselves to see if you're in the faith (II Cor 13:5)
- b. We easily lie to ourselves & live with ourselves still on the throne of our lives

# 2. Use hard times to repent & soften our hearts

- a. Bible says whom God loves He chastens (Heb 12:6)
- b. It's God's grace in getting your attention

# 3. Accept this world won't give proper results

- a. Even when we repent & turn to God, things may not go smooth sailing
- b. This world isn't where the godly get rewarded

### Final thoughts

- 1. God continually wants to help, but there's a limit (*Read II Pet 3:9-10*)
  - a. Some think, 'well we're America, we'll never cease from being a nation or being free'i. We're not guaranteed that!
- 2. Is God finished w/ the Jews? No way (Rom 11)
  - a. Thru Israel's fall we all now know the truth
  - b. If God won't cast away Israel forever, He won't cast me away either!
- 3. We'll either be used...
  - a. To bring God to an unbelieving world or
  - b. Be judged as ungodly by the unbelieving world
