

Ezekiel 26-28:19 – 20 September 2015

Introduction –

People will remember how you act toward them in hard times. This will become part of what you're known for. **Today we'll continue to look at the 4 attitudes not to have towards others when their enduring hard times.**

Chapter 26:1-28:19 – The Nation of Tyre

1. 26:1-6 – Tyre rejoice that Judah's destruction meant more people would turn thru their land for business.
 - a. **The 4th attitude not to have towards others when their enduring hard times is to be Self-centered & indifferent to helping.**
 - b. They shouldn't have rejoiced that their booming economy happened b/c the people of God fell into judgment.
 - c. Many nations would come against them, not just Babylon. Later the Greeks.

2. 26:7-11 – Notice it is “he” throughout these verses, not “they”.
 - a. Described Babylon coming against Tyre just 1 year after this prophecy was given (see vs 1)
 - b. Siege lasted 13 years.
 - c. Most of the people escaped to the Island city.
3. 26:12-14 – 322 BC Alexander the Great told them to surrender their Island city, they refused.
 - a. Alex tried naval battle but failed.
 - b. Like this prophecy, he then took their old city and built a causeway out to the island.
 - c. ‘Top of a rock’ – can’t tell it was even a city.
4. 26:15-21 – Tyre wasn’t the typical idol worshipping, war-like people.
 - a. They were more a secular, business-class people.
 - b. “Shall the isles tremble” – Even distant sophisticated nations wondered at Tyre’s fall.
 - c. By the Way, the modern city of Tyre is a few miles away from the original, not the same.

5. 27:1-3 – God here, as in Rev 18, speaks against commercialism. Greedy commerce.
 - a. God says that Tyre says they are as beautiful as a fine ship.
6. 27:4-7 – The greatness of their commerce.
7. 27:8-26 – They traded with the whole world.
 - a. Until the “east wind” (Babylon) came and finally broke them.
8. 27:27 – All their alliances and riches will perish when they perish. Was it worth it?
9. 27:28-31 – All the distant merchant shall mourn for Tyre.
10. 27:32-36 – **Do you want to be known as the rich merchants of the world?**
 - a. **Or do you want to be known as a nation that served the Lord?**
 - b. **Trump known for his money. Billy Graham is worth \$25 mil, but known for his commitment to God.**
11. 28:1-2 – This is about the King of Tyre Ittobaal II.
 - a. Reminds us of the Anti-Christ from II Thes 2

b. Either controlled by God or by Satan.

12.28:3-5 – It's hard for those that trust in riches to enter into heaven.

13.28:6-10 – The king who called himself God, is slain.

a. Now we'll get a behind the scenes look at the puppeteer that was controlling this wanna-be God king.

14.28:11-15 – Satan's original state.

15.28:16-19 – Satan's destruction.
