Hebrews 12 – 14 July 2024 "Fixing Our Lives On Victory"

Introduction

- *Chap 11-13 finishes the book of Hebrews with our response to receiving the New Covenant in Jesus
- *Chap 11 was the famous Hall of Faith chapter
- *This showed 'If we have true Biblical faith, the result is having a daily life of godly action'
- *Chap 12 continues our response to receiving the New Covenant in Jesus w/ 'How to fix our lives on victory'
 - *Are you coasting into heaven or...
 - *Do you have a heart of compassion that loves Jesus & wants to see more people gain eternal life?
- *Once our lives are made from a fabric of faith in Jesus, now let's "Fix Our Lives On Victory"

Today, we'll see 4 keys to fixing our lives on victory

#1 – Fix our eyes on Jesus (Vs 1-3)

Read Vs 1

- 1. We have a cheering section, like home-field advantage in a College basketball game
 - a. Even better, our cheering section are all players that went to our college & now in NBA
- 2. How would we practice ahead of THAT game?
 - a. We'd eat better and practice more
- 3. If 'laying aside' distraction or sin, it's fully gone
 - a. It's matter of believing we're better w/o it

Read Vs 2-3

- 1. We're *encouraged* by the cheering section, but we *get our instructions* from the coach
- 2. Jesus is the perfect coach (Hall of Famer)
 - a. Our coach is seated b/c work is complete
 - b. He's not pacing/nervous, neither should we
- 3. He's the creator & completer of our salvation
 - a. Read Phil 1:6: Jesus finishes what He starts
- 4. What was the joy that was set before Him?
 - a. Read Matt 13:44: Winning you to His side!

- b. If He was willing to endure for my sake, I can endure in response to His great love for me
- 5. He warns us to meditate on what Jesus has done lest we start changing our minds & shrink back
 - a. Battlefield is in our mind belief, endure

#2 – Fix our hearts on sanctification (Vs 4-11)

Read Vs 4

- 1. How hard are we really fighting against sin?
 - a. Is it just mental gymnastics or real change?
- 2. Bring it out of the mind into the real world by talking about our temptations
 - a. 'Today I was tempted to _____, but I didn't!'
- 3. Are we willing to resist sin even at a real cost?

Read Vs 5-6

- 1. Constantly meditate & receive God's Word
 - a. We're leaky vessels and easily forget
- 2. "Whom He loves, He chastens"
 - a. God's correcting these Jewish believers thru this letter to turn away from the Law

b. Paul wants them to receive this chastening, b/c it's worse if God *doesn't* bother helping

Read Vs 7-8

- 1. Experiencing the correction of God is a sign you've been born again & you're in the family
 - a. When you hear the Word of God, do you hear it as if it's *for you*? You're in the family
 - b. When a Christian corrects you, even if they're wrong on parts...and you're willing to listen You're in the family
- 2. Don't be concerned when you're being convicted of sin, be concerned when you're not

Read Vs 9-10

- 1. A good earthly father corrects us w/ what's best *for him*; God corrects us w/ what's best *for us*
 - a. Jesus' correction of us is selfless & loving
 - b. C. Spurgeon "There isn't a drop of God's wrath in it, it's all sent in love"

Read Vs 11

- 1. Discipline seems to be a bad thing, but we don't live by "seems to", we live by truth
 - a. Sun seems to be bigger at sunset, it's not
 - b. The earth doesn't seem to be round, but it is
- 2. Takes a little hindsight before we see discipline's value
 - a. Takes faith to accept truth over what *seems* to be

#3 – Fix our hands on helping others (Vs 12-17)

Read Vs 12-13

- 1. Help each other to go straight and be active
- 2. Now's the time for action
- 3. This is the attitude by which we should do (Read) Heb 3:13
- 4. Ask someone, 'what ails you?', then help them

Read Vs 14-15

- 1. We must actively be pursuing peace and godliness, or we will become ineffective and dry
 - a. On a dry lawn that last to die are the weeds
 - b. We see those roots of bitterness clearest in the dry seasons
 - i. Choke them out with pursuing godliness
- 2. Dry today? (Read Isa 40:31) wait upon God
 - a. What does it take to "fall from grace"?
 - b. Stop flapping your wings

Read Vs 16-17

- 1. You're either imperfectly pursuing godliness like Jacob or you're into the flesh like Esau
- 2. As Esau found out w/ the blessing of his father, there are things that we can't go back and undo
 - a. Had a child out of wedlock? Can't undo
 - b. There are lifelong effects of many decisions
 - c. Pursue godliness to not fall for these traps

#4 – Fix our minds on our unshakable future (Vs 18-29) Read Vs 18-21

- 1. Enacting of the covenant of the Law was done at Mt Sinai, which will be compared to the enacting of the covenant of Grace done at Mt Zion
- 2. Law at Sinai represented by darkness (vs 18)
- 3. Law at Sinai represented by harsh communication regulations (vs 19-20)
- 4. Law at Sinai brought fear (vs 21)

Read Vs 22-24

- 1. Grace given at Zion is spiritual & life (vs 22)
 - a. There's a deep reality to what we now have
- 2. Grace given at Zion is about relationship (vs 23)
 - a. We come together w/ those love firstborn, Jesus
- 3. Grace given at Zion is settled by innocent blood (vs 24)
 - a. We've come directly into the presence of Jesus by His blood

- 4. "Speaks better than the blood of Abel"
 - a. The blood of Abel's death cries for justice.
 - b. Jesus' blood cries out 'justice has been satisfied by grace'
- 5. Not about Abel's death, but his sacrifice
 - a. Abel's sacrifice was only a shadow of faith looking forward to the real sacrifice of Jesus

Read Vs 25

- 1. Don't ignore those that speak of the covenant of grace b/c those that rejected Moses giving the Law were cast out, it'll be worse for you
- 2. There were consequences for rejecting the Law, & even more so for rejecting the Lord's grace

Read Vs 26

- 1. If you reject Jesus, in the end, He'll crush you to powder (from Luke 20:18)
- 2. There's more grace in OT then many know of, & more judgement in the NT than many know of

Read Vs 27

- 1. Things of this earth when shaken will crumble to nothing; things of heaven when shaken will rise
- 2. I long for the day when all the perversion on TV & internet will crumble into nothing
- 3. I long for the day when our bodies will crumble to nothing, revealing an eternal, unshakable one

Read Vs 28-29

- 1. Living a life in reverence to God from gratitude...just...makes...sense
 - a. Read Rom 12:1 KJV This is reasonable
- 2. Jesus said in Luk 12:49, I am come to send fire on the earth and what will I if it be already kindled
 - a. John said his baptism was just water, but Jesus would baptize us w/ the H.S. & w/ fire
 - b. Everyone's work shall be revealed by fire (I Cor 3:13)
 - c. Take heart if this world's giving you trouble b/c of what Peter wrote (Read I Pet 1:5-7)

Conclusion

So, let's not just live w/ faith in Christ, but let's fix our lives on victory!

1. Fix our eyes on Jesus

- a. If you've accepted His cross, He's not angry & frustrated with you
- b. He seated at rest & cheering you on

2. Fix our hearts on sanctification

- a. Accept His discipline, it's b/c He loves you
- b. If we meditate on His Word, it will keep us from sin

3. Fix our hands on helping others

- a. Share your temptations, & they'll share
- b. Bring a spirit of meekness

4. Fix our minds on our unshakable future

a. Can't we pursue great things even at great earthly cost, knowing *nothing* can steal eternity with Jesus from us
