I Kings 9-10 –28 July 2022 "The Fulfillment Of Faithfulness"

Introduction

- *I & II Kings demonstrate that a king's allegiance to God's Law is the key to success & protection

 *The 1st half of I Kings depicts the reign of Solomon

 *The 2nd half of I Kings begins the divided kingdom
- *Chap 1-2 purging of the sinful men
- *Chap 3-4 desire for wisdom yet struggles w/ purity
- *Chap 5-7 building temple, we warned of letting worship turn into work by turning from Jesus
- *Chap 8 dedication prayer asking God to be near
- *Today God responds to Solomon's prayer & more
- *Read I Kings 9:1 He's completed "all his desire" & is in danger of a mid-life crisis (25 yrs into 40 yr reign)
- *Every day there's a choice; living for God or for self
- *Today we'll see 3 enduring principles of a faithful walk with the Lord

1st principle of a faithful walk: Blessing is conditioned on obedience (Chap 9:2-9)

Read Chap 9:2-3

- 1. I've heard, I've hallowed & I will help
- 2. This is the starting point w/ God, He wants to bless and support us
- 3. He makes Himself available to all that ask

Read Vs 4-7

- 1. If, then statements
 - a. Relationship w/ God is based on His grace
 - b. But we can withhold His blessing on us by disobedience
- 2. David was promised his throne will be forever
 - a. Now Solomon is offered same if there's obedience...but there won't be obedience
 - b. The people & temple would be cast out for disobedience, but not God's promise of David's throne forever

Read Vs 8-9

- 1. Disobedience to the Lord is to serve other gods
 - a. Which are no gods at all
- 2. This isn't about relationship, it's about the blessing of fellowship and prospering

Cross-References

- 1. Read Eph 2:10 We're born again to do good works and live in doing them for His glory
- 2. Read Jam 1:12, 25 Continuing faithfully thru temptation is rewarded with blessings
- 3. Disobedience separates friends, oh you're still in the family but your lost friendship
 - a. And in God's family, we're removing ourselves from the place of blessing

2nd principle of a faithful walk: Gaining 'more' by compromise is worthless (Chap 9:10-28)

Read Chap 9:10-14 – *His gifts to Hiram*

- 1. We read in II Chr 8:2 that Hiram gave them back to Solomon and he restored them strong
- 2. Don't give away God's Promised Land that's against God's Word and His plan
- 3. This just caused Solomon to spend money to fix up these camps once they were returned to him

Read Vs 15-19 – Solomon's Subjects

- 1. The Oriental Institute has uncovered ruins of Solomon's stables in Megiddo
- 2. Levy was 30,000 men take from the nation
- 3. Building up of central govt is not trusting God
 - a. God blessed him with riches that should have been turned back into worship again
 - b. Forced labor to build what? Central govt
- 4. This levy will be more than worthless as they revolt later against the whole concept of this work

Read Vs 20-23

- 1. Israelites were paid for their hard service
- 2. Canaanites put under tribute to pay and serve
 - a. More compromise Israel was told to wipe out these sinful Canaanites
- b. Now they'll cause trouble for years to come Read Vs 24
- 1. Millo was a small fortress he built for his wife Read Vs 25
- 1. These 3 times a year were at the 3 feasts Read Vs 26-28 *Solomon's Navy*
- 1. He had a great Red Sea navy obtaining gold Cross-References
 - 1. What will he use God's blessings for?
 - a. Read I Cor 3:12-15
 - b. Achan tried to gain more than God blessed
 - c. Gehazi tried to gain more also (II Kings 5)

3rd principle of a faithful walk: God's always faithful to keep His promises (Chap 10)

Intro

- 1. This is the famed story of the Queen of Sheba
- 2. Read I Kings 3:13 God promised him honor Read Chap 10:1-3
 - 1. Notice she had heard of the name of the Lord
 - a. What Solomon had promoted around the world was the wisdom and knowledge of God
 - 2. Very different than what Hezekiah will later do
 - a. II Kings 20 Hezekiah invites Babylonians
 - b. He did it to brag of his greatness

Read Vs 4-7

- 1. Solomon didn't brag of his great possessions
 - a. He answered her questions & THEN she was impressed by seeing his possessions
 - b. This is the opposite of Hezekiah with the Babylonians later

Read Vs 8-10

- 1. Wisdom didn't lead to strive and envy, but led to peace and joy
- 2. God's blessing led him to honor & respect Read Vs 11-13
- 1. They mutually blessed each other & she left Transition
 - 1. What else did God promise to bless him with?
 - 2. Again, Read I Kings 3:13 Riches

Read Vs 14-17

- 1. 25 tons of gold comes in every year
- 2. Many shields were made of the gold
- 3. We'll read in Chap 14 of Shishak, King of Egypt, coming & talking away the gold of Israel
 - a. Recently in 1939 Shishak's mummy was found in Tanis, Egypt in an amazing gold-covered sarcophagus

Read Vs 18-20

1. Throne of ivory covered in gold decorated w/ lions

Read Vs 21-23

- 1. Egypt, Babylon & Assyria are all weak at this time. Greece is just beginning to rise.
- 2. Israel is the jewel of the world

Read Vs 24-29

- 1. Solomon made Israel the center of the world's economic system
- 2. All b/c he asked for wisdom & God gave him wisdom, honor AND riches

Cross-References – *God keeps His promises*

- 1. Heb 10:23 We can keep going b/c He's faithful
- 2. I Cor 1:4-9 We have all blessing until the end
- 3. Phil 1:6 He that began a good work, will complete it in us

Conclusion

I don't want to just be saved; I want to be faithful

- 1. Blessing is conditioned on faithful obedience
 - a. Salvation is based on His work, a blessed full life is based on our obedience
- 2. Gaining 'more' by compromise is worthless
 - a. "What shall it profit a man if he gains..."
- 3. God's always faithful to keep His promises
 - a. He's wanting to bless you, don't hinder Him by running into the flesh life
- What if we've been unfaithful already repent

Read II Chr 7:14 – Heard, forgive & will heal

*Have you settled for just being saved?

Living without God working blessings in your life

*Or do you want to be faithful?

Enjoying the fulfillment of what God wants to bless you with
