Luke 4:1-14 – 29 January 2023 "Tempted To Prove Whom We Serve"

Introduction

*Luke began w/ the angelic announcements, then births of John the Baptist and our Lord Jesus

*Chap 2 told the accounts during Jesus' adolescence

*Chap 3 we had the ministry of John the Baptist that taught us about the fabric of our relationship w/ God being one of *repentance & worshipping a reliable God*

*Today we see the temptation of Jesus at the hands of Satan in the wilderness

*If Jesus' baptism proclaimed whom He served *Then His temptation proves whom He serves

Read Vs 1

- 1. Jesus moved in all ways empowered by the Spirit of God
- 2. Includes being led into wilderness for a season

Read Vs 2

- Jesus was led of Spirit to be tempted by devil

 Aren't we told in 'The Lord's Prayer' to
 pray we can avoid this?
 - b. Yes, we'll come back to this
- 2. There are 3 usages or applications of *'temptation'* (or proving) in the Scriptures
 - a. <u>Satan</u> tempting man to do evil (I Cor 7:5, Jam 1:13-14)
 - b. <u>Man</u> tempting God to push Him into our will (Deut 6:16, Act 5:9, I Cor 10:9)
 - c. <u>God</u> tempting man so we can know what's in our own heart (Deut 8:2-3, Heb 11:17)
 - d. Like jealousy it's only w/o sin when God does it, b/c He knows all & has all authority
- 3. Compare the 'Sons of God' here between 1st Adam (Luk 3:38) & last Adam (Jesus) Luk 3:22
 - a. God breathed breath of life into <u>Adam</u>, then he was tempted by devil & so <u>Jesus</u> the 2nd Adam was filled w/ Spirit, then tempted by devil
 - b. <u>Adam</u> faced them in easiest of conditions whereas <u>Jesus</u> faced these in harshest of conditions

Today, we'll see the 3 arenas of temptation in our lives and the ONE solution to them all!

1st arena of temptation is in our flesh (Vs 3-4)

Read Vs 3

- Not indicative, but subjunctive the word "if" means 'since' – Satan didn't *doubt* His deity, but wanted Him to *display* his deity
- 2. Satan is saying, "Why deprive yourself of needed food?" "You should *serve yourself*"
- 3. Satan says, "Aren't your *physical needs greater* than your spiritual needs? No they're not
- 4. Throughout Jesus ministry, you'll see Him meeting physical needs in order to get to the spiritual needs of the people

Read Vs 4

1. Adam/Eve faced the same enemies that Jesus is here facing (flesh, spirit & mind)

- a. Adam/Eve fell into an image-based religion instead of Word-based relationship they had
- b. What Adam/Eve didn't do; Jesus proves Himself worthy by believing & using the eternal Word of God
- c. Read II Cor 10:3-4 We fight spiritually!!
- 2. Jesus' response shows that the *spiritual is of greater need than the physical*
- 3. Notice Jesus points us to our need for ALL of God's Word (II Tim 3:16)
- 4. As we go thru the 3 temptations, we'll get a glimpse at the Trinity
 - a. Here, the Word of God is none other than *Jesus Christ*

2nd arena of temptation is in our spirit (Vs 5-8)

Read Vs 5

1. He shows Jesus the glory of all the kingdoms of man that will ever be (past, present & future)

Read Vs 6-7

- 1. Satan wants Jesus to believe that *He can* accomplish His mission in a different way
 - a. Satan's says, 'You don't need pain of cross'
 - b. Satan says, 'You can just serve under me & it will be easier'
- Satan had the right to offer this b/c it was his
 a. God created it (Gen 1)
 - b. God gave all dominion to Adam (Gen 1:28)
 - c. Adam forfeited all to Satan (Rom 6:16)
 - i. We blame bad on God, but Satan runs it all
 - d. Now the good news is that Jesus won it all back at the cross (Matt 13:44, Rev 5:1-8 & 11:15)

Read Vs 8

- 1. Armor of God from Eph 6:11-17 only offensive weapon is the Word of God
- Get in line (behind Me) Satan order of priority & of worship
- 3. The Trinity is seen here in that it's *the Fathe*r that is supreme

3rd arena of temptation is in our mind (Vs 9-12)

Read Vs 9-11

- 1. Our 3 enemies from (Read) I John 2:16
 - a. Lust of the flesh Jesus (stones to bread);
 Adam (tree was good for food)
 - b. Lust of the eyes Jesus (throw down from temple); Adam (pleasant to the eyes)
 - c. Pride of life Jesus (worship me); Adam (desired to make one wise)
- 2. Now Satan tries to introduce mental confusion by using partial truth
 - a. Satan quotes from Psm 91:11-12 leaving out the phrase 'in all Thy ways"
 - b. Partial truth can be much hardly to recognize the than a whole cloth lie
 - c. Satan & his ministers can transform themselves to appear like servants of the light (II Cor 11:13-14)

Read Vs 12

1. Matt says "<u>Again</u> it says" (Matt 4:7)

- 2. We must use the Bible in light of other parts of the Bible to understand, believe & use it properly
- 3. Word of God isn't here to serve our will, we use the Word of God to know & serve God's will
- 4. The Trinity is seen here in that it's the *Spirit of God* that should lead us and not our own will

Read Vs 13-14

- 1. Satan shows up 3 times in the Bible
 - a. Gen 3 tempting man about God
 - b. Job 1 tempting God about man
 - c. Luke 4 tempting the perfect Godman!!
- 2. Matthew 4:11 says that as Satan departed, God sent angels to minister or serve Jesus
- 3. Asking for or gaining supernatural help isn't the problem but tempting God is
 - a. Bending Him to our will is gross, but He delights to help the helpless
- 4. So we see that Jesus was led (vs 1), & filled (vs 1) and now empowered (vs 14) by the Spirit!!
 - a. Same is available to us today

Conclusion

We fight temptations in the same way that Jesus did in our **flesh**, **spirit** and our **mind**

We can't stand before the devil apart from Jesus'

Word, serving the Father and led of the Spirit

But we'll never live a sinless life, though we aim for it

Didn't you notice back in Luke 4:1-2

Jesus was led of Spirit to be tempted yet we're told in "The Lord's Prayer" of Luke 11:4 to pray that we're <u>led not</u> into temptation but delivered from the evil one Jesus beat Satan's temptation for us

Heb 4:15 – Jesus was tempted yet without sin We don't have to conquer temptation perfectly, b/c only Jesus could do that for us!!

Now we have a choice

Turn to Rom 5:12-21: You're either in Adam or Jesus Read I Cor 15:22: Who's your representative head?

So we too are tempted to prove whom we serve, but not tempted by Satan but by our love that constrains us!!
