I Samuel 23-25 – 17 March 2022 "Turning Away Other's Wrath"

Introduction

- *David has been anointed king to replace Saul, but God hasn't dethroned Saul yet (about 15 years)
- *David won't take the throne until II Samuel begins
- *David is on the run from Saul thru Judea
- *In these situations, we need to be sure there's not wrath & anger flying out from us
- *Mark Twain said, "Anger is an acid that can do more harm to the vessel in which it's <u>stored</u> than to anything on which it's <u>poured</u>."
- *Now we all face the wrath of others on occasion
 - *Maybe you've been a store clerk yelled at
 - *A child facing a drunk parent in the line of fire
- *Sometimes the wrath of man is deserved & other times it's not deserved
- *Today let's gets some tips to prepare ourselves to turn away other's wrath and anger

1st tip for turning away wrath is to live in daily communion with God (Chap 23)

Read Vs 1-5

- 1. David is staying busy for the Lord
- 2. He doesn't stop serving just b/c he has difficult things in life
 - a. King Saul hunting him, didn't stop him
 - b. His men were fearful, didn't stop him
- 3. Developing a closer walk w/ Jesus everyday

Read Vs 6

1. Abiathar was ready to serve the Lord Read Vs 7-8

- 1. Saul hates David even more than Philistines!
- 2. William Alger said, "Men often make up in wrath what they lack in reason."
- 3. This is illogical to hate David, it's pure envy

Read Vs 9-14

- 1. Staying close to God and God instructs him
- 2. Read I John 2:19-20 God instills the truth within us as we stay close to His side
- 3. So, w/ every situation, David cries out to God Read Vs 15-18
 - 1. This will be Jonathan's last visit to David to strengthen him for the work ahead

Read Vs 19-24

- 1. Short-sighted Ziphites turned in David to Saul
- 2. Notice Saul still thinks God is on his side (Vs 21) Read Vs 25-29
 - 1. Believe God stopped holding back Philistines & allowed them to break thru right now to save David
 - 2. When you believe God actually has power and control over your enemies & your circumstances, you'll cling to him in great devotion

2nd tip for turning away wrath is to seek mercy and reconciliation (Chap 24)

Read Vs 1-4

- 1. Saul laid aside his outer garment to 'use the bathroom', so David picked it up & cut the end off
- 2. David's proving that he's 'cut from a different cloth' than Saul by sparing Saul's life
 - a. Saul seeks more glory, David seeks mercy
 - b. Saul seeks hatred, David seeks repentance

Read Vs 5-6

1. David wouldn't raise a hand against God's anointed king, he would wait til God Himself did

Read Vs 7

- 1. Not only would David not do it, he had enough integrity to not allow his men to do it either
- 2. You see, <u>mercy</u> often speaks louder than words
 - a. Only God knows if Saul will repent
 - b. In the meantime, David seeks reconciliation

Read Vs 8-15

- 1. Best display of mercy in the entire Bible outside of Christ Himself!
 - a. Vs 9 "Don't believe the lies that I'm against you"
 - b. Vs 11 "I have proof that I could have killed you"
 - c. Vs 12 "Only the Lord hold yours & my destinies"
 - d. Vs 13 David humbly says, "I'm nothing"
- 2. Read Eph 4:31-32 We treat others with mercy, b/c Christ gave us ultimate mercy!

Read Vs 16-22

- 1. Saul knows thru David's deeds that David is right w/ the Lord and he isn't
- 2. David knows to give God the place of wrath and HE will repay Sual in due time
 - a. Therefore if your enemy hungers, feed him...in so doing you'll heaps coal of fire on his head

3rd tip for turning away wrath is to use Godly wisdom (Chap 25)

Intro

- 1. This chap presents story of Nabal's foolish treatment of David, leading to David's wrath
- 2. Wisdom will be seen in Nabal's wife Abigail Read Vs 1-9
 - 1. David sent some men to Nabal at work in Carmel, during a harvest of type... a time of plenty
 - 2. David has been working 'under the table' for Nabal and is seeking his payday

Read Vs 10-12

1. Nabal won't pay up seeking to take advantage of these under the table workers...b/c he can

Read Vs 13

- 1. In ungodly minute David is ready for revenge
- 2. Nabal's theft is wrong but it's not a capital offence

Read Vs 14-17

1. Even Nabal's servant knows that Nabal (meaning foolish) acted foolishly

Read Vs 18-20

- 1. Wise Abigail brings restitution for David
- 2. She knows it's not good enough to apology, but you actually have to pay what's been stolen

Read Vs 21-22

1. David is determined to wipe out all the males in Nabal's house

Read 23-31

- 1. Abigail pleads w/ Daivd to relent
 - a. Vs 25 She's willing to take the blame even saying that if she was there, she would have treated David's men rightly
 - b. Vs 26 She prays against David's enemies
 - c. Vs 27-28 She brings restitution & asks forgiveness

- d. Vs 30-31 God will make you ruler in
 Israel & then this little incident will seem like no big deal
- 2. She doesn't have to lie, just calm things down Read Vs 32-35
 - 1. David admits she stopped him from sinning b/c she reminded him of who he really is & his destiny
- 2. A soft answer turns away wrath (Psm 15:1a)

Read Vs 36-38

- 1. Nabal had a type of stroke, died 10 days later
- 2. He didn't see anything coming, the fool

Read Vs 39-44

- 1. David sees the Lord's hand in judging Nabal for wronging the Lord's anointed...David
- 2. David is so taken with Abigail's wisdom that he wants her close
- 3. Nothing wrong w/ taking people into your 'house', but don't distort marriage like this

Conclusion

So how prepared are you to deal with the angry, wrathful, bitter or just plain mean?

1. Live daily in communion with God

a. Sin will keep the Bible away from you, but the Bible will keep sin away from you

2. Seek mercy and reconciliation for others

a. By the power of God within you, let others see that you seek their best, even if they're seeking your worst

3. Use Godly wisdom within yourself

- a. Wisdom is seeing things from God's point of view
- b. God would have us seek truth & peace
