### Psalms 87-89 – 18 May 2025 "So We May Live, Jesus Took Death"

### **Introduction**

- \*Though all OT passages are about God's plan to redeem mankind thru His Son Jesus, some passages are very easy to see it like today's passage
- \*To believe God's Word is to believe that it is all about Jesus Christ (Read John 5:46)
- \*Jesus Himself tells us that the OT is all about Him (Read Luk 24:25-27)
- \*We finish Book 3 of the Psalms w/ the final 3 Psalms being a clear representation of Jesus' final entrance into Jerusalem just before going to the cross
- \*We begin w/ a representation of the joy of entering Jerusalem Hosanna, Hosanna to the King!
- \*To the agony of the cross & finally the Great Exchange of His righteous for our sin & death
- \*So today we'll see 3 foreshadowing of Jesus coming to Jerusalem & the cross that fateful week

## #1: Beloved Jerusalem – Jesus comes to bring life (Psm 87)

#### Read Psm 87:1-3

- 1. Now where is it that glorious things are spoken of Jerusalem & Mt Zion?
  - a. What's so special about Zion's foundation?
  - b. Read Isa 28:16 Both Paul (Rom 9) & Peter (I Pet 2) quote this as speaking of Jesus
- 2. Zion's gates is reference to the leader's meeting
  - a. When Jesus is your foundation, there is righteous leadership & judgement in the city

#### Read Vs 4-5

- 1. The Psalmist gives a comparison here
- 2. When speaking to the small nations around Israel; Philistia, Tyre & Ethiopia, he says...
  - a. When someone is born in Egypt (Rahab) or Babylon, it's worth mentioning (citizenship)
  - b. BUT when someone is born in Jerusalem, now THAT'S special b/c God will establish those people

#### Read Vs 6

- 1. We've spiritually been born in Jerusalem (Heb 12:18, 22-24)
- 2. Gal 4 says we're born of Mt. Sinai (natural birth) but need born of Mt. Zion by Christ's work

#### Read Vs 7

- 1. All ability to prosper & bear fruit comes from You
- 2. Read Jer 2:13 Jesus Christ has everything we'd every need
- 3. He's placed his identity in Jerusalem today & the New Jerusalem for eternity

# #2: Engulfed In Darkness: Jesus came to the cross (Psm 88)

Intro – Set to the tune of or played on a musical instrument of *Mahalath Leannoth* meaning sickness & depressed

Heman is 1 of 4 very wise men in Solomon's days

#### Read Psm 88:1-5

- 1. As a picture of Jesus Christ, interesting that it starts with a note that there is a relationship w/ God, yet vs 5 says it is like He's cut off from God
  - a. He isn't cut off, but He's *like* those cut off
- 2. Jesus cried out, My God, My God why...

#### Read Vs 6-9

- 1. There's the feeling of darkness in which no earthly help is there to support
  - a. From vs 8 my friends are afar off
- 2. Jesus quoted (Read) Psm 41:9 of Himself
  - a. Not only have betrayers left like Judas, but even dear friends like Peter are nowhere to help
- 3. Notice vs 6-7 God Himself brings this wrath
  - a. Jesus bore God's wrath, so we wouldn't

#### Read Vs 10-12

1. The call is to save him from death so he can yet have relationship & praise God

- a. Now, no man can rise again to praise God, but the Godman Jesus did...b/c He was perfect
- b. No greater way to see this than to see Jesus' resurrection never to return to this separation

#### Read Vs 13-18

- 1. Here maybe the best expression of loneliness
- 2. On that cross, the only time Jesus ever experienced separation from the Father
- 3. Separation *IS* death
  - a. The 1<sup>st</sup> death is separation from the body
  - b. The 2<sup>nd</sup> death is separation from God
    - i. Read Isa 59:2 If we die in our sins, we're eternally separated from God
  - c. Thus the 2<sup>nd</sup> death is called Outer Darkness

# #3: The Great Exchange: Jesus' resurrection brings eternal life...at a price (Psm 89)

Intro -Maskil – to be contemplated

Ethan is 1 of 4 very wise men in Solomon's days

#### Read Psm 89:1-4

- 1. As if it's a celebration at Jesus' resurrection that mercy has finally be established forever
  - a. All b/c of, not us, but God's faithfulness
- 2. David's descendant, the Messiah, has finally been established permanently

#### Read Vs 5-10

- 1. We celebrate the faithfulness of the Lord
  - a. Faithfulness to do what you said you would
  - b. We can count on Him to deliver us
- 2. We celebrate the strength of the Lord
  - a. He not only wants to deliver, but He CAN
- 3. Great reference to crushing Egypt (vs 10) b/c this is 1<sup>st</sup> & most vivid pic God gave of defeating death

#### Read Vs 11-14

1. This is the victory of the cross that Jesus won all things back under His authority

#### Read Vs 15-18

1. To have relationship with the risen King is to know abundant blessing thru His strength

#### Read Vs 19-24

- 1. He's speaking of King David, but ultimately the great Son of David, Jesus
- 2. Formerly, Jesus received visions at the end of Satan's temptations
- 3. Jesus was exalted by John at His baptism
- 4. Certainly, in Jesus' life, no enemy could deceive Him

#### Read Vs 25-29

- 1. Only Jesus is God's firstborn
- 2. Read John 1:14 Only begotten of Father...
- 3. 1stborn mainly indicates the son of inheritance a. Notice (vs 27) He's made higher than kings

#### Read Vs 30-37

- 1. Now the promise to the church
  - a. Though we may need corrected, we won't ever be forsaken (Read John 10:28-29)
- 2. Our security is b/c Jesus' rule is immoveable
  - a. Why? B/c God made a one-way covenant

#### Intro to 38-45

- 1. These next verses take a hard turn
- 2. After talking of the joy of what we receive, now we see the price Jesus paid to give it to us

#### Read Vs 38-40

- 1. He was wounded for our transgressions
- 2. Jesus took God's wrath on the cross

#### Read Vs 41-43

1. At His arrest said He could've called 12 legions of angels to be loosed but withheld

#### Read Vs 44-45

1. Surely on the cross He was beaten so severely He no longer looked like a man & died young

#### Read Vs 46-48

- 1. These verses cry out for a Savior that is beyond a mere man
- 2. Only one man could ever promise eternal life to you & men

a. Jesus said, 'Destroy this temple & in 3 days I'll raise it up again." (Read John 2:19)

#### Read Vs 49-51

- 1. As Isaiah prophesied, the Lord has laid on Him the iniquity of us all'
- 2. He was wounded for our transgressions
- 3. Read Heb 2:9b-10 It was all for us
  - a. To bring many people into glory forever

#### Read Vs 52

- 1. Each book of the Psalms ends with a version of 'Blessed be God forever Amen & Amen'
- 2. Reminding us focus should never be off of Him

### Conclusion

So, what a beautiful picture of Christ's love for us

- 1. He came into His beloved Jerusalem to bring us life
- 2. He was willingly engulfed in darkness on the cross
- 3. He performed the great exchange by taking our sin & death, while gifting us eternal life
