Mark 10:1-27 – 4 July 2021 "Approaching Jesus"

Introduction

- *Jesus is travelling for 3 years teaching (last wk of earthly life begins in Mark 11)
- *Mark 9 was His last week in northern Israel (Galilee)
- *Mark 10 He spends time in Perea east of the Jordan
- *Jesus has begun to reveal His true mission to die
- *Mark 11 Jesus goes to Jerusalem for last week of His life on earth before His death (Hint: He comes back)
- *In Perea in Mark 10, 3 types of people come to Jesus, which we will examine today
- *Interesting that not many people that come to Jesus actually receive His gift of salvation into eternal life

So today, 3 types of people that come to Jesus

1st Type of person that approaches Jesus is The Worker (Vs 1-12)

- 1. Using a circle diagram w/ center meaning the heart of God & outer edge representing self-effort
- 2. We represent the *worker* as thinking he's close to God but really headed toward the edge
- 3. Always looking at how they can use the "rules" to their advantage, instead of getting to the true meaning of the rules

Read Vs 1-2

- 1. 'As He wont': means as was His pattern or habit
 - a. His focus for these 3 years has been to teach
 - b. The focus of His help to us is to help us change & grow by showing us the truth vs. lies
- 2. Read Matt 19:3 "Any cause?" Some people ask questions just to stumble another person
 - a. Not b/c they want the answer, but to make themselves look good (I received a phone call)

Read Vs 3-5

- 1. They're striving to keep the Law AND their rules perfectly, but also seeking fault in others
 - a. They misunderstand the giving of the Law
 - b. The burden of the Law is to lead us to Jesus' perfect work and that we can't
 - c. The burden of the Law isn't for us to slam others, but to help us know the mind of God
- 2. Divorce Law allowed for divorce where there was already sin, to limit even more sin
 - a. Exp: Eye for eye was to limit retaliation
 - b. The heart of God is beyond the letter of the Law to the intent of the Law

Read Vs 6-9

- 1. In the created design is God' perfect will and THAT'S what we should be aiming for
 - a. There's God's grace to cover our sins but always shoot for God's best
 - b. Principle Always go to the created design

- i. Don't look to church history for how to run church, look to the creation of the church
- 2. Notice another note: Some argue that Jesus never addressed homosexual relationship
 - a. Certainly, the Law warns of the dangers of the sin of a homosexual lifestyle
 - b. Certainly, Paul does also in Romans 1
 - c. Jesus DOES address the subject right here
 - i. He doesn't mention also other corrupt forms of marriage, He simply speaks of the right way
 - ii. Besides, Jesus wrote it thru Lev and Paul also

Read Vs 10-12

- 1. Def of Adultery is not genuine or pure
- 2. Adultery violated the very picture that God is using marriage to represent (Christ & the Church)
- 3. Read Rom 7:2-4 We as the 'wife' were under the banner of our 'husband' the Law
 - a. When we died to self, we're free to married another, even Jesus

2nd Type of person that approaches Jesus is The Worshipper (Vs 13-16)

- 1. Using our circle diagram We represent the *worshipper* as thinking he's close to the edge but really he's headed toward the heart of God
- 2. Knowing they're undeserving of God's love
- 3. Looking for God to grace them w/ goodness

Read Vs 13

- 1. These parents just wanted a blessing from Jesus on their children by His grace & kindness
- 2. The disciples rebuked these parents
 - a. People that have nothing to offer God are not a bother to Jesus
- b. These are the ones He delights to help

Read Vs 14

- 1. "Of such is the Kingdom" If these little children die, they're already in the Kingdom
- 2. Jonah Those that don't know left from right

Read Vs 15-16

- 1. "Receive the kingdom as a child" With childlike not childish faith
- 2. Kids know how to receive w/o earning

Read Luke 10:38-42 – Mary & Martha

- 1. There's always work to be done, but if you're not a worshipper...
 - a. Then you're motivated by the wrong thing
 - b. And you won't have the energy of the H.S. to complete the tasks set before you

3rd Type of person that approaches Jesus is The Wonderful (Vs 17-27)

- 1. Using our circle diagram We represent the *wonderful* as thinking he's right at the heart of God, but he's actually absorbed with self
- 2. Having a wonderful self-made life that is independent of God is an abomination to God

Read Vs 17-18

- 1. Notice he kneels He's showing outward subordination to Jesus. Will he show it inwardly?
- 2. Jesus starts by checking his understanding of good
 - a. This ends up being the heart of the problem...he thinks he's good

Read Vs 19-20

- 1. Read Rom 3:19 The Law was designed to stop the mouth from justifying itself
- 2. His mouth isn't stopped yet by looking at ½ Law

Read Vs 21-22

- 1. In relation to man, he's "doing good", but his dependence is in himself, not God
- 2. Read Luk 16:13-15 Can't serve you & God
- 3. In relation to God (1st 5 Laws), He's not righteous at all, he depends on money as his god

Read Vs 23-24

- 1. Jesus is speaking spiritually: When He says physical riches, He means spiritually trusting in the physical money for attaining goals in life
- 2. Interpret all that Jesus says spiritually

Read Vs 25-27

- 1. Some teach of a "Camel Gate" at Jerusalem
 - a. As if you work hard and you can do it
 - b. No such thing Disciples got it (see vs 26)
- 2. Then in vs 27, it takes a conversion of the heart, which is a work of God
 - a. The only way to change the priority of your heart, is to ask the Lord to give you a new heart

Conclusion

So not everyone that comes to see Jesus has come on the right terms. How have you come?

1. Are you a Worker?

- a. Are you striving about rules and standards?
- b. Instead look for the principles behind the Laws...that will lead you to the heart of God

2. Are you a Worshipper?

- a. Do you come to God knowing that He's worthy of devoting or time / attention to?
- b. Do you do what you do, motivated by returning love to Him for His great love & grace to you

3. Are you the Wonderful?

- a. Do you still believe that you have what it takes to earn eternal life? You don't.
- b. Our greatest efforts could never be perfect
- c. Jesus paid it all, all to Him I own
 - i. Sin had left a crimson stain
 - ii. But Jesus washed it white as snow
