I Chronicles 10-12 –11 September 2025 "Faith Rising"

Introduction

- *I Chronicles 1-9 opened with the genealogies of the Jews that're reconstituting in Israel after the Captivity
- *Now in Chap 10 the Ezra begins to recount Israel's history beginning with the fall of their first king Saul
- *Though there was much victory in defending against surround national enemies, Saul's reign was a dark time in Israel's spiritual life
 - *Witchcraft & Baal worship was publicly in use
 - *Disobedience to Samuel & the prophets
- *Saul reigned from 1050-1010 BC, God began His plan to replace him in 1030 BC
- *Though deep behind the scenes, faith is rising in the heart of a young shepherd boy from Bethlehem

Today, we'll see 3 results of faith in God's plan

#1 – Saul: Insubordinate Actions Cause Rejection (Chap 10)

Read Vs 1-3

- 1. Battle came from Jezreel, Saul fell back to Mt Gilboa in north central Israel
 - a. Night before this battle is when he consulted w/ the witch at Endor
- 2. Saul did have other sons by a concubine
 - a. We'll see him try taking the throne later
- 3. But this is just the providence & timing of God
 - a. It's been about 15 years David has waited
- 4. When David was coming to avenge himself of Nabal for not paying him...
 - a. Nabal's wife Abigail taught David that vengeance is the Lord

Read Vs 4-6

- 1. Saul mortally wounded so he hastens process
- 2. Armorbearer committed suicide, not Saul

Read Vs 7-10

1. Saul's armor now sent around as a trophy

2. What abuse if they had caught him alive

Read Vs 11-12

- 1. A proper burial for Saul and his sons
- 2. Later David returns their bones to their home tribe of Benjamin for burial (II Sam 21:12-14)

Read Vs 13-14

- 1. Unfaithfulness: Giving your trust & allegiance to another to lead you this is TWO crimes
 - a. He didn't trust Yahweh to keep His word
 - b. He did trust demonic spirits intending to keep their word
- 2. His independence from God & disobedience to God in not killing the Amalekites showed his great unfaithfulness years ago

#2 – David: Incremental Actions Cause Reward (Chap 11:1-9)

Read Vs 1-3

1. Many things happened after Saul's death before David became king of all 12 tribes

- a. Judah anointed David king in Hebron
- b. Abner, Saul's general, anointed Ishbosheth, Saul's son by a concubine, king over Israel
- c. Abner turns to David, but Joab, the general, kills him & Ishbosheth then dies by treason
- 2. All Israel agree here that God has placed David as the king over ALL of them
- 3. They admit even while Saul was king, David was living the life of someone worthy to be king
- 4. David was anointed 3 times as king
 - a. By Samuel; recognized by God (I Sam 16)
 - b. Over Judah; recognized by family (II Sam 2)
 - c. Over all Israel; recognized by nation (II Sam 5 & I Chr 11)
- d. Divine decisions may take time to manifest Read Vs 4-9
 - 1. Jebusites are Canaanite people that mocked David saying they only needed blind & lame to defend Jerusalem (Jebus) against David

- David asked for an invasion thru water tunnel
 Joab took David up on the offer
- 3. Stronghold or castle of Zion is a part of modern Jerusalem that is south of the Temple Mount
- 4. Joshua briefly took Jebus but couldn't keep it in his own strength
 - a. David relied on God & His power to inherit
 - b. Same as our salvation it's not of our own craft, method or power, but God's ability
- 5. II Sam 5 says Hiram, King of Tyre helps David build his house
 - a. This foreign, young king made peace & trade w/ David to which David perceived this as God's blessing to be used for ALL Israel
 - b. Thus began a long beneficial relationship

#3 – David's Men: In-line Actions Cause Rejoicing (Chap 11:10-12:40)

Read Vs 10

1. Like David, these men had nothing apart from trusting in God's Word

- a. Read I Sam 22:1-2 They started in distress
- b. But they made David king according to God's Word
- 2. Whether you're like David or a downcast, trust in God!

Read Vs 11-14

- 1. **Jashobeam & Eleasar**; Singular men of courage & faith when no one else had it
- 2. Eleasar, so committed, his hand was curled to the sword after the battle (II Sam 23:10)
- 3. Now II Sam 23:11 also speaks of Shammah
 - a. This completed David's "first three" or most notable 3 leaders

Read Vs 15-19

- 1. These *unnamed three* had loyalty & love
 - a. This wasn't a command or request by David, but simply a desire
- 2. David was so thankful for these men's kindness that he valued the water high enough to offer it to God Faith loves deeply

Read Vs 20-21

- 1. David had men that knew their position
- 2. They weren't pridefully fighting for position

Read Vs 22-25

1. **Benaiah** was notable for his skill to defeat man AND beast

Vs 26-47 (Read Vs 26)

- 1. At least 46 men on this honor roll
- 2. Vs 26 is the general Joab's brother Asahel
 - a. He was killed by Abner in the revolt of Ishbosheth after Saul's death
- 3. Vs 41 is Uriah the Hittite, Bathsheba's husband

Vs 1-15 (Read Vs 1-2)

- 1. This era of David's life is in I Sam 27-30
- 2. 23 men of Benjamin who used the slingshot
- 3. 11 men of Gad who used the shield & spear
- 4. These men are said to be as good as 100 or 1000 men

Read Vs 16-22

- 1. Men of Benjamin & Judah defect to David during Saul's reign including Amasai
- 2. Men of Manasseh also defected
- 3. Would've taken these men great pains to change sides w/ Saul still on the throne dedication

Vs 23-37 (Read Vs 23)

- 1. When David was being anointed King at Hebron, he recognized those that recognized him
 - a. It's 340,822 men of valor from all tribes
- 2. Notice Levites are also listed in vs 26-26
 - a. They're never restricted from going to war

Read Vs 38-40

- 1. There is now unity for the first time in a while
- 2. There is joy for the first time in a while

Conclusion

So I Chronicles opens with a discussion of the most critical question of life; Will you trust God?

- 1. Saul demonstrates that insubordinate actions will cause God to reject us
 - a. Let's use our freedom & will to live under God's good yoke
- 2. David demonstrates that incremental actions of faith lead to God's rewards
 - a. Have we accepted that delayed gratification is most often God's plan for rewarding us
- 3. David's Men demonstrate that in-line actions will cause there to be rejoicing
 - a. Have we grown comfortable with our position & station in life, serving from there

This is what we need, this is what America needs...

- ...to see a resurgence in our trust in God
- ...to see *faith rising*
