Isaiah 18-20 – 16 November 2023 "The Unstable Powers Of Man"

Introduction

- *In chap 13-23, God has Isaiah address mostly the foreign nations that have influenced Israel
- *It's appropriate that 'judgement should begin at the house of God' (I Pet 4:17), but it doesn't end there!
- *Isaiah is told to give these prophecies (hard messages) to many foreign nations
- *They're designed to remind Israel that God is just & won't let others get away w/ their wickedness
- *Additionally, they're designed to show God's heart to save & bring righteousness to ALL people
- *We're prone to become intimidated by the powers over us – as Israel is of the nations around them
- *We need to see the powerful of this world thru the lens that God's see them in

So today, let's look at 3 characteristics of the powers of men in this world

#1: The powers of men are subdued very easily by God (Chap 18) – Burden of Ethiopia

Read Chap 18:1

- 1. "Beyond" is better translated 'borders'
- 2. Ethiopia (Gk for 'black') is same as Cush (Hb)
- 3. Territory in the Bible called Cush or Ethiopia is the modern territory of Sudan, Ethiopia, etc
- 4. Ham's 3 sons (Phut, Cush, Mizraim) (Gen 10)
- 5. Later, Moses married Ethiopian woman (Num 12)

Read Vs 2

- 1. 'Scattered & peeled' is tall & pale
- 2. Current events are detailed in II King 18-19
 - a. Assyria is coming against Hezekiah (Judah)
 - b. Ethiopia rules Egypt & is feuding w/ Assyria
 - c. Ethiopia & Judah are sending ambassadors seeking an alliance against Assyria

Read Vs 3-4

- 1. When the Lord raises a banner or blows a trumpet you know He's calling armies for war
- 2. But we see 'God takes His rest'

- a. God doesn't need Ethiopia's help for Judah to survive coming onslaught on the Assyrians
- b. In fact, we read (II Kings 19), this is time God smites 185,000 Assyrians with ONE angel

Read Vs 18:5-6

- 1. This's pic of judgement on the land of Ethiopia
- 2. It seems this is Ethiopia's constant problem, that of trusting in man instead of turning to God
 - a. We'll see Ethiopia later in the coalition of nations from Eze 38-39 coming against Israel
 - b. We see Ethiopia listed in Dan 11 as helping Anti-Christ leading to Battle of Armageddon
- 3. You say, 'well this judgement seems harsh'
 - a. They had many chances to know Jesus
 - b. Gospel even came thru Philip & Ethiopian Eunuch thru royal house to whole land (Acts 8)
 - c. Apostle Matthew went & was martyred there
 - d. God's judgement is always just

Read Vs 7

- 1. Certainly, there's thriving Ethiopian church now
- 2. Ultimately Ethiopia will come to Israel in the Millennial Kingdom with gifts (Read Zec 14:16)

#2: The powers of men are given chances to change (Chap 19) – Burden of Egypt

Intro- Nice study of Egypt: Isa 19-20, Jer 46 & Eze 29-32 Read Chap 19:1-3

- 1. Between 720-710, Egypt fell into civil war dividing into 12 sections
- 2. With political weakness they resorted more to their powerful demonic sorcerers for guidance
- 3. This civil war was called God's judgement
 - a. What does God need to do to subdue men?
 - b. Just let them to their own devices

Read Vs 4

- 1. By 671 BC Assyrian king Esarhaddon ruled Egypt & was known as an especially cruel ruler
 - a. Civil strife isn't always God's judgement, but it can be

Read Vs 5-10

1. A great drought will bring disaster to a land whose economy is completely dependance upon it

a. Natural disasters aren't always God's judgement, but they can be

Read Vs 11-15

- 1. Egypt will be left with only politically inept leaders to govern
 - a. Poor leaders aren't always God's judgement, but they can be
- 2. Why would God send them "a perverse spirit"?
 - a. B/c they've already rejected the true wisdom of God especially thru Moses & others
 - b. Read II Thes 2:8-11
- 3. Notice in vs 15 that poor political leadership even results in a bad economy

Read Vs 16-17

- 1. When judgement of God comes, the subdued nation produces reverence toward the Lord & toward His people Israel
- 2. Quite a switch; never happened yet for Egypt
 - a. Not in the days of Moses, David or Jesus
 - b. But it will during the Millenium

Read Vs 18-21

- 1. It produces a changed national heart in that they begin to take on the identify of Israel
 - a. Take on the language (vs 18)
 - b. Build altars (vs 19) & commit to God (21)

Read Vs 22

- 1. During the Millenium there will need to be further chastisement on the nation of Egypt
 - a. But notice, it's for their healing
 - b. Read Zec 14:16-19 Egypt specially here

Read Vs 23-25

- 1. Peace between bitter enemies, peace among the whole world in the Millenium
 - a. With Israel "in the midst of them"
- 2. See, 'My people' is b/c they all belong to God
 - a. Like Judas the Zealot and Matthew the tax collector becoming friends
 - b. Even great enemies find friends under the banner of Jesus Christ

#3: The powers of men will soon be forgotten (Chap 20) – The Sign of the Prophecy's Veracity Read Chap 20:1

- 1. It's the year 713 BC & Assyria has been pushing closer to Egypt thru the land of Israel
- 2. Tartan = "a general officer" not specific name
- 3. This mention of Sargon was, for a while, the only mention of Sargon in ancient writings
 - a. Til 1842 when Botta discovered the ruins of Sargon's palace on northern edge of Nineveh
 - b. Many treasures & inscriptions showing him great, yet his name completely disappeared except for the Bible
- c. Much of it is now in the Louvre in France Read Vs 2
 - 1. God often had his prophet perform visible signs to catch interest of the mind: what's going on
 - 2. What's the message?
 - a. The message isn't nudity but poverty

- b. Not representing a pervert but a prisoner
- c. Wants them to know he already sees them as subjected to Assyria

Read Vs 3-4

- 1. The point of the sign; this is what will happen to Egypt & Ethiopia
- 2. Warning is to Israel; don't trust unredeemed man
 - a. Not one is better than the other
 - b. Read Psm 118:8 Whom do you trust?
- 3. Isn't it just like the devil to rob, kill, destroy and lead away empty and naked?
- a. Yet with God it's different Read Rev 19:8

Read Vs 5-6

- 1. This is God's direct warning to Hezekiah to not trust in the Egyptians to help against Assyria
- 2. Read all about it in II King 18-9
 - a. Read II Kings 18:20b-22 Whom do you trust?
 - b. That's always the question

Conclusion

So what kind of powerful people do you have around? Remember these principles to aid our relations w/ them

- 1. Powerful people are subdued very easily by God
 - a. That mean boss might be gone tomorrow
 - b. Greater is He that is in you, than he that is in the world
 - c. Nothing is too difficult for God

2. Powerful people are given chances to change

- a. Never forget, God is seeking to change our mean boss's heart and bring salvation
- b. Let not be praying justice on them but mercy and grace on them

3. Powerful people will soon be forgotten

- a. Saddam Hussein thought he was the reincarnation of Nebuchadrezzar He's gone
- b. Every evil name will be forgotten w/ all their influence over you
- c. But those that love the Lord will be remembered (Read Rev 3:5)
