Joshua 22-24 – 26 August 2021 "Preserving A Proper Spiritual Posture"

Introduction

- *The theme of the Book of Joshua could be "Will Israel have faith and <u>believe</u> God?"
- *The prosperity of Israel's future life will be directly proportional to:
- *How well (or not) they exterminate the evil, sinful lifestyles of the Canaanites
 - *How well they act on implementing God's ways
- *All tribes have conquered & set up their God-given land; Joshua now gives his parting remarks to all
- *All that's left to do is to reinforce in them Joshua's desire to preserve a godly legacy that will continue to bless God, bear fruit and bless for the people
- *So today, the book concluded with 3 tips to preserve a proper spiritual posture

1st tip to preserve a proper spiritual posture is: Avoid Boilerplate; Get into the details (Chap 22)

Read Chap 22:1-9

- 1. The 2.5 Tribes fulfilled their obligations as part of Israel & are released back home
 - a. Released w/ the command to "get into the details" of serving & loving God (see vs 5)
- 2. We have too much boilerplate Christianity
 - a. Don't live by slogans & generalities instead live by detailed convictions driven by time spent w/ God & His Word
 - b. We need a generation w/ critical thinking that have Biblical convictions that aren't negotiable

Read Chap 22:10-12

- 1. 2.5 Tribes are spiritually dull to make this altar even if it was only as a witness & not sacrifices
 - a. Sacrifices only allowed at Tabernacle
 - b. Everyone was already commanded to appear at Tabernacle 3 times a year at Feasts

2. They're leaving room for honest people to ask questions of them

Read Chap 22:13-20

- 1. Israel has real spiritual concerns
 - a. Are they intending to commit idolatry?
 - b. Israel knows they're one nation that are accountable together
- 2. They 1st send respected Phineas to asks questions
 - a. Notice they're not making the boilerplate decision to go to war w/o getting the details
 - b. Getting into the details involves helping those you're accountable for

Read Chap 22:21-29

- 1. They wanted a memorial, not an altar
- 2. BOTH have good intentions
- 3. BOTH wanted to remain in the purity of God

Read Chap 22:30-34

- 1. There's joy b/c BOTH are seeking God
- 2. All b/c they were willing to dive deep

2nd tip to preserve a proper spiritual posture is: Don't study your sin, but study God (Chap 23)

Read Chap 23:1

- 1. Some get stricken w/ age (Elisha, Joshua, Zachariah) while some don't (Moses, Caleb)
 - a. Doesn't mean God loves them any different
 - b. James killed but Peter spared
 - c. Doesn't mean one was more sinful than the other, but it keeps the focus on God & His plan

Read Chap 23:2

- 1. This is Joshua's farewell address to the leaders
- 2. What would you say, given one last chance?

Read Chap 23:3

- 1. Begins message w/ praise to God (Judah 1st)
- 2. Thinking on the positive (Read Phil 4:8)

Read Chap 23:4-5

1. Continue in faith & God will continue to do

Read Chap 23:6-10

- 1. Don't even talk about the sin, study God
- 2. We can trap our mind into studying our sin instead of studying God
 - a. You can't beat the darkness by dealing with it, you simply need to deal with the light.
 - b. Don't think of emptying your time from sin, think of filling your time with godly activities

Read Chap 23:11-13

- 1. By physically intermixing, they will spiritually contaminate them...that's the problem
- 2. God's not trying to keep us from marrying unbelievers
 - a. He's trying to get us to marry believers
 - b. B/c He knows unbelievers will be trouble

Read Chap 23:14-16

- 1. Msg to the leaders ends w/ a warning
- 2. In the Old Covenant, God's blessings were contingent upon obedience
- 3. Only a loving God would warn of sin's trouble

3rd tip to preserve a proper spiritual posture is: Intentionally choose whom you'll pursue (Chap 24) Intro

1. Chap 24 brings us Joshua's final address to the whole nation prodding them to see God's value

Read Chap 24:1-13

- 1. The historical prologue is the reminder of the reality that God is good and they need Him
- 2. We need to be reminded often how good God has been to us

Read Chap 24:14-15

- 1. "Choose whom"
 - a. It's theirs to <u>choose</u>—God has given freewill
 - i. That's one of the greatest, most overlooked blessing from God
 - b. It's not a choice of <u>if</u> you'll serve but <u>whom</u> you'll serve
 - i. Whatever your master passion is, is your God

Read Chap 24:16-25

- 1. Joshua forced them into strong commitment
- 2. Let's be bold and clear with our convictions
- 3. We need to intentionally remove the evil around us and replace it with good
 - a. Good habits, good friends, etc

Read Chap 24:26-28

- 1. Is your choice to live for Jesus a matter of public record? Do your friends know?
- 2. This rock would be a constant, continual reminder
 - a. Don't center our life around a decision for Christ long ago
- b. Center it on a <u>daily craving</u> to know God

Read Chap 24:29-33

- 1. This's respectful add-on to a great author's work
- 2. Vs 31 A move of God rarely goes into the 2nd generation

Conclusion

So the challenge for all Israel as they've entered, settled & established themselves in the Promised Land, has always been:

Will they have faith to believe God's ways are best?

They've learned some great tips for how to prosper; now they just have to KEEP THE FAITH

1. Avoid boilerplate; Get into the details

a. Don't live by slogans & generalities, but develop detailed convictions

2. Don't study your sin; Study God

a. Don't dwell on the darkness, but learn about the light

3. Intentionally choose whom you'll pursue

- a. If I asked your best friend what the biggest pursuit of your life is, what would they say?
- b. The service to your god WILL lead to either eternal life or eternal death. Choose wisely.
