Genesis 12:10-14:24 – 3 October 2019 "Abraham's Commitment To God"

Introduction

Chapter 12 begins with Abraham making a great commitment to God by leaving Ur of the Chaldees and coming into the land of Canaan.

And so too, we as Christians, have made a commitment to God.

But what was Abraham's commitment? Was it a commitment to come to Canaan? Was it a commitment to try out a lifestyle of following the Lord? Or was it a commitment to a life-long relationship and fellowship with the Creator of the Universe?

There are 4 parts of Abraham's commitment to God that we'll examine today in chapter 12-14.

1st thing about Abraham's Commitment to God is that <u>he became resilient</u> (Gen 12:10-13:4)

- 1. Read Vs 10
 - a. He's been a wanderer in land of Canaan
 - b. Common to have these famines come
- 2. Read Vs 11-16
 - a. Abraham feared for life. He has a choice. Trust God or take matters into his own hands.
 - b. He failed trust God & deceived Egyptians.
 - i. Didn't lie, he deceived
 - ii. Read Gen 20:12
 - iii. Deception is just as bad or worse
 - c. Why should he have trusted God to protect?
 - i. God promised (Gen 12:2) make him into a great nation.
- 3. Read Vs 17-20
 - a. What a sad reality when the world has more integrity than the Christians.
 - b. Not only time Abraham does this (Gen 20)

- 4. Read Chap 13:1-4
 - a. The church often struggles to know what to do with those that fall into sin and come back into the church.
 - b. Abraham comes back to Bethel, to his first love, to being a worshipper, to the beginning.
 - i. He could have return to Ur but didn't.
 - ii. Read Heb 11:15-16
 - c. This is a great model for how to help the prodigals that come back.
 - d. Abraham shows great resiliency here
 - i. We have that great ability b/c of God's great grace!!
 - ii. Abraham is demonstrating his commitment to return to God even after very low times.
 - e. Do you believe coming back to the altar, confession and repentance is ALL that it takes?
 - i. Remember your 1st love, repent and do the 1st works. (Rev 2:4-5)

2nd thing about Abraham's Commitment to God is that <u>he became a peacemaker (Gen 13:5-18)</u>

- 1. Read Vs 5-9
 - a. Although rich, Abraham wasn't seeking riches, he was seeking brotherly peace.
 - b. The flesh settles disputes by asking himself
 - i. What can I get out of this?
 - ii. How can I protect myself thru this dispute?
 - c. The spiritual person settles disputing by asking themselves...
 - i. How can I help everyone come to know God thru this?
 - ii. How can I prevent others from being hindered in their relationship w/ God & the church?
 - d. Abraham's commitment to God made him seek a good spiritual outcome to each situation that he faced.

- 2. Read Vs 10-13
 - a. So Abraham sought the spiritual goal of peace and Lot sought the fleshly goal of gain.
 - b. Lot
 - i. In pursuing personal gain this righteous man, will be vexed by wicked Sodom.
 - 1. Read II Peter 2:7-8
 - 2. Lot literally gives up peace for the pursue of money.
 - ii. In vs 12 he was willing to "pitch his tent toward Sodom".
 - 1. The fleshly goals drag you in slowly.
 - 2. Gen 14:12 Lot dwelling in Sodom.
 - 3. Gen 19:1 He's a leader in Sodom.
 - c. Abraham
 - i. Are we willing to suffer the wrong, as Abraham was in order to do the right thing?
 - 1. Turn the other cheek (Matt 5:39)
 - 2. Go the extra mile (Matt 5:41)
 - 3. Suffer the wrong in court (I Cor 6:7)

- 3. Read Vs 14-18
 - i. In pursuing the spiritual gain, he also gained the physical blessing of God.
 - 1. Read Matt 6:33
 - 2. Psm 37:11
 - ii. This is the only piece of earth that has a title deed given right from God.
 - iii. We don't read of Abraham having any warsw/ Canaanites. He had confederacy (14:13)

iv. Lot had the choice land, and it brought war!

3rd thing about Abraham's Commitment to God is that <u>he became loyal to people (Gen 14:1-16)</u>

- 1. Read Vs 1-7
 - a. All these battles are recorded in history.
 - b. These 4 kings from modern Iran begin by attacking all the surrounding nations in vs 5-7
- 2. Read Vs 8-10
 - a. Rockefeller read his Bible then drilled for oil in Saudi Arabia b/c of these tarpits.

- 3. Read Vs 11-15
 - a. Gives us an idea of his wealth w/ 318 men.
 - b. Dan = upper Galilee at base of Mt Hermon,
 - c. About 125 mi. Forced march = 25 mi/day
 - d. Surprised them at night & pursued them 45 more miles to Damascus into a boxed canyon.
- 4. Read Vs 16
 - a. Abraham could have been bitter at Lot for choosing the best land, but he wasn't.
 - b. Abraham's commitment to God had a byproduct of him being committed to all the people around him.
 - i. He had confederacy w/ Canaanites (vs 13)
 - ii. He had a large household of people (vs 14)
 - iii. He had enough loyalty for Lot that he was willing to fight.
 - c. Are you loyal & faithful to people in your life? Do we have urge to always move around?
 - i. Disloyalty=mark of end times evil (Matt 24:10)
 - ii. Commitment to God=commitment to His body

4th thing about Abraham's Commitment to God is that <u>he became a city on a hill (Gen 14:17-24)</u>

- 1. Read Vs 17-24
 - a. As Abraham's fame spread b/c of his deeds, he was sure to return the praise/glory to God.
 - b. Turn to Matt 5:14-16
 - c. Abraham wouldn't take anything from the redeemed kings, b/c he wanted it known that God had provided all that he needed.
 - d. He possessed lots, but owed nothing to any man.
 - e. Abraham wanted only that God would get the glory.

Now let's deal with this mysterious character Melchizedek in vs 18-20

- 1. Vs 18 Bread and wine
 - a. Only used here and in communion
 - b. Symbols of the Word and the Spirit
- 2. Vs 18 Priest of the most high God
 - a. This priesthood is superior to the Aaronic
 - i. The lesser person is always blessed of the greater person.
 - 1. Turn to Heb 7:1-7
 - 2. This isn't Shem IAW vs 6
 - ii. Levi pays tithes to Melchizedek while in the loins of Abraham.
 - 1. Turn to Heb 7:8-10
 - b. Jesus was a priest in the line of or after the order of Melchizedek and not after Aaron.
 - i. Read Psm 110:4
 - ii. Read Heb 7:17
- 3. Whole Bible fits together (Gen, Psm, Heb)

Conclusion -

Today we've seen 4 parts of Abraham's commitment to God

- 1. He became resilient
 - a. Come back to your 1st love & 1st works
- 2. He became a peacemaker
 - a. Seek spiritual goals of peace/love & God will provide the rest
- 3. He became loyal to people
 - a. Faithfulness to God shows up as faithfulness to the people in your life
- 4. He became a city on a hill
 - a. When glory comes, we're able to give it to God
