Scripture, Prayer, Worship

We prioritize the authority of God's Word in our lives and cultivating habits of worship and prayer, both personally and in communal gatherings. These are:

1. Prioritizing the authority of God's Word

We believe that all Scripture is the inspired, infallible, authoritative Word of God, and is fully reliable and trustworthy.

2. Cultivating the habit of prayer

3. Cultivating habits of worship

(Brian)

You know, I wish I would have planned ahead a little bit instead of just teaching you about worship. We could have had Crystal come out with the team and we could have actually worshipped together while we learned about it.

Crystal comes out first, her and I will talk.

(Brian)

Crystal, can you tell the congregation what the mission of the worship team is on a Sunday morning?

(Crystal)

Our goal as a worship team is to provide a space for you to encounter the presence of the Lord that's free of distractions. We want to fade into the background and allow the Lord to shine. Some of our favorite moments are when we hear you guys singing your hearts out and we can step away and just let the praise arise.

As you and the team lead us in worship, there seems to be different types of songs that we sing. I've heard you say in meeting and in your worship trainings that different songs lead us into unique heart postures. Can you explain what that means?

(Crystal)

So many of our songs are based on scripture and especially the book of Psalms. Knowing the kind of song we are singing helps us to take on the right heart posture before the Lord. We want to really mean the words we are singing! For instance, when we sing the song Anthem, we are taking on the posture of being amazed by the character of God and we just want to adore him. We point the words of the song straight to the Lord and use them as the roadmap to bring him glory, all together, in unison.

Songs of Adoration - Anthem

I'd describe songs of adoration as the kind of song we sing when we are in awe of who he is. It's when our worship gets personal.

Songs of Repentance - Bridge of Heal Our Land

I love these kinds of songs because they are songs where we humble our hearts before Jesus and ask him to purify us. They are songs that remind us of our desperate need for a Savior.

Songs of Request - Fresh Wind

You see these kinds of songs all throughout the Psalms. I also think of the Lord's Prayer where Jesus asks, "Let your kingdom come and your will be done..." In these songs of request, we are partnering what God wants to do and asking him to release his kingdom on earth.

Songs of Faith - Yes I Will

These are songs of declaration. They are like a reminder to ourselves of the truth of the word. Sometimes when you come into worship you feel it and you're full of faith, and other times it's like we need to sing it until we believe it. That's why I don't mind a little repetition in songs because as we sing something the reality of the words we are singing goes deeper and deeper into our hearts and we begin to really believe what we are saying.

Songs of Praise - Chorus of Great Are You Lord

These are some of my favorites. The power of God's people glorifying the Lord, declaring things together all at one time, is unmatched.

Praise Worship Teaching songs are songs that are totally focused in on God. Some of the other songs might talk about how we feel a little more, but these songs are all about Him - declaring his power, his greatness, his glory, his holiness. One of my favorite things about these songs is that they help us to get our eyes off of ourselves. We all need that every now and then, right? To forget about our worries, our schedules. You know how entertainment can do that? Helps us forget about ourselves for a little bit. Well, praise does an even better job of that. It's perspective shifting, realigning, and life changing. Praise is like a tune-up for the soul.
