

The Call of Freedom / I'm Calling You Out / You Better Take This Exit

Exodus 10:3 (NLT)

So Moses and Aaron went to Pharaoh and said, "This is what the LORD, the God of the Hebrews, says: How long will you refuse to submit to me? **Let my people go**, so they can worship me.

The Best Gift you can give GOD is your **Obedience**.

"Obedience is up to you. The outcome is up to God." -Dr. Dharius Daniels

You will either you have a **Heart of Obedience or Heart of Disobedience**.

1 Samuel 15:22-23 (NLT)

²² But Samuel replied, "What is more pleasing to the LORD: your burnt offerings and sacrifices or your obedience to his voice? Listen! **Obedience is better than sacrifice, and submission is better than offering the fat of rams.** ²³ Rebellion is as sinful as witchcraft, and stubbornness as bad as worshiping idols. So because you have rejected the command of the LORD, he has **rejected you** as king."

Disobedience produces Rebellion, and Rebellion causes Rejection

Lastly, and I ran out a time, but we stopped with the idea that freedom needs to be viewed out of two lenses-

I'm Free From, So I can be Free To	
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Romans 6:6-7 (NASB) ⁶knowing this, that our old self was crucified with Him, in order that our body of sin might be done away with, so that we would no longer be slaves to sin; ⁷for he who has died is **freed from sin**.



Free From Mental And Emotional Strongholds Of Every Kind

A stronghold is a faulty thinking pattern based on lies and deception.

Deception is one of the primary weapons of the devil, because it is the building block for a stronghold. What strongholds can do is **cause us to think in ways which block us from God's best!**

Example: View GOD has a mean cruel TASK Master who punishes you for all your mistakes

Danger of Strongholds is you see GOD incorrectly & yourself incorrectly!

- He doesn't love me
- I'm not worthy

The process of deliverance often consists of three main parts:

- 1. Tearing down strongholds,
- 2. Removing legal rights
- 3. Casting out the remaining demons.

There are 3 different types of death a man can experience:

- Physical death: the separation of a man's spirit from his body
- Spiritual death: the separation of a man from God while he is still living and walking upon earth
- **Eternal death:** the separation of man from God's presence forever. This is the second death, an eternal state of being dead to God.

- **2 Corinthians 10:5 (KJV)** ⁵Casting down imaginations, and every high thing that exalteth itself against the knowledge of God, and bringing into captivity every thought to the obedience of Christ;
- 2 Corinthians 10:5 (GW) ... We take every thought captive so that it is obedient to Christ.
- **2 Corinthians 10:5 (PMJ)** Since my mind be playing tricks on me and I need to be obedient to GOD I've learned whenever negative thoughts hit my mind. When I THINK I THANK!



Psalm 18:1-3 (NKJV) ¹ I will love You, O LORD, my strength. ² The LORD is my rock and my fortress and my deliverer; My God, my strength, in whom I will trust; My shield and the horn of my salvation, my stronghold. ³ I will call upon the LORD, who is worthy to be praised; So shall I be saved from my enemies.

God is the first and true stronghold.

Shield & Stronghold Both are military terms suggesting protection & deliverance from enemies.

The enemy creates counterfeit strongholds in our flesh.

These are **un-surrendered**, **un-healed or un-crucified** areas of the old nature, self-life, or thoughts.

They rise up and resist the Spirit-given life. **Self-protectiveness built them and maintains them, aided by the lies and temptations of the enemy.** We are to resist them by pulling them down. Like David we don't need self-protection any longer - we have the Lord to protect us! His grace is all-sufficient.



2 Corinthians 10:3-6 (NKJV)

³ For though we walk in the flesh, we do not war according to the flesh. ⁴ For the weapons of our warfare are not carnal but mighty in God for pulling down strongholds, ⁵ casting down arguments and every high thing that exalts itself against the knowledge of God, bringing every thought into captivity to the obedience of Christ, ⁶ and being ready to punish all disobedience when your obedience is fulfilled.

2 Corinthians 10:3-6 (NLT)

³ We are human, but we don't wage war as humans do. ⁴ We use God's mighty weapons, not worldly weapons, to knock down the strongholds of human reasoning and to destroy false arguments. ⁵ We destroy every proud obstacle that keeps people from knowing God. We capture their rebellious thoughts and teach them to obey Christ. ⁶ And after you have become fully obedient, we will punish everyone who remains disobedient.

The weapons of the world are learning, personal influence, impressive credentials (1 Cor. 1:26), rhetorical polish (1 Cor. 2:1), and the like. These things Paul had discounted and discarded (Phil. 3:4-8). He did **not wage war as the world does** or use their weapons.

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1 Corinthians 1:26 (NLT)

²⁶ Remember, dear brothers and sisters, that few of you were wise in the world's eyes or powerful or wealthy when God called you.

The **weapons** Paul used were the proclaimed Word of God and prayer (Eph. 6:17-18), weapons with **divine power**.

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1 Corinthians 2:4 (NLT)

⁴ And my message and my preaching were very plain. Rather than using clever and persuasive speeches, I relied only on the power of the Holy Spirit.

Ephesians 6:17-18 (NLT)

- ¹⁷ Put on salvation as your helmet, and take the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God.
- ¹⁸ Pray in the Spirit at all times and on every occasion. Stay alert and be persistent in your prayers for all believers everywhere.



2 Corinthians 4:4-10 (NLT)

⁴ Satan, who is the god of this world, has blinded the minds of those who don't believe. They are unable to see the glorious light of the Good News. They don't understand this message about the glory of Christ, who is the exact likeness of God. ⁵ You see, we don't go around preaching about ourselves. We preach that Jesus Christ is Lord, and we ourselves are your servants for Jesus' sake. ⁶ For God, who said, "Let there be light in the darkness," has made this light shine in our hearts so we could know the glory of God that is seen in the face of Jesus Christ. ⁷ We now have this light shining in our hearts, but we ourselves are like fragile clay jars containing this great treasure. This makes it clear that our great power is from God, not from ourselves. ⁸ We are pressed on every side by troubles, but we are not crushed. We are perplexed, but not driven to despair. ⁹ We are hunted down, but never abandoned by God. We get knocked down, but we are not destroyed. ¹⁰ Through suffering, our bodies continue to share in the death of Jesus so that the life of Jesus may also be seen in our bodies.
