- 1. How we handle money reveals what is most important to us.
 - 66 21 'For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also.'" ~ MATTHEW 6:21 (NIV)
 - 66 33 'But seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well.'" ~ MATTHEW 6:33 (NIV)
 - ¹⁷ Jesus said, 'give to Caesar what belongs to Caesar, and give to God what belongs to God.'" ~ MARK 12:17a (NLT)
- 2. Money has a strong power to pull us away from what matters the most.
