KING ASA'S FIRST THIRTY SIX YEARS

TRUSTED THE LORD AND GOD GRANTS JUDAH Peace and Success.

He smashed the sacred pillars and cut down the Asherah poles. 4 He commanded the people of Judah to seek the Lord, the God of their ancestors, and to obey his law and his commands. 5 Asa also removed the pagan shrines, as well as the incense altars from every one of Judah's towns. So Asa's kingdom enjoyed a period of peace. 6 During those peaceful years, he was able to build up the fortified towns throughout Judah. No one tried to make war against him at this time, for the Lord was giving him rest from his enemies."

- 6 Skim 2 Chronicles 16:1-10. Is it surprising to you after all that Asa has been through in his first 36 years as king that he stops trusting in God for his final 5 years? Why or why not?
- **7 -** Read 2 Chronicles 16:9. In what ways does this verse inspire, comfort or challenge you?
