

- 4 In 1 Kings 3 the first three verse about areas where Solomon does not follow the Lord's law. Why do you think the writer starts by including these spiritual weaknesses of Solomon?
- F Read 1 Kings 3:4-9 and Solomon's conversation with God in his dream. What are your first impressions of this conversation? What stands out to you about the way Solomon make's his request to God? What can we learn about how we approach God in prayer from these verses?
- 6 Read 1 Kings 3:10-14. How would you describe the way that God answers Solomon's prayer? Are there take-a-ways for followers of Christ today in the way that God answers Solomons prayer back then?
- **7** Share with your group some areas in your life that you need wisdom these days.
- 8 Closing Prayer. Before you pray have someone read James 1:5, Matthew 6:33 and Proverbs 3:5-6 aloud. Take some time to pray for one another asking for God's wisdom for each other.
